Save the date: Beaufort 2024



Beaufort is a triennial art event that has been taking place since 2003 along the sea walls, beaches, and dunes of the Belgian coast. For six months, art lovers, residents, and tourists can come to admire remarkable and memorable works of art in each participating coastal municipality.

The 8th edition of the Triennale, which starts with an opening weekend on March 30th, 2024, promises outstanding artistic encounters again: under the motto "Fabric of Life", curator Els Wuyts will bring contemporary art installations to the Belgian coast.

After the triennial, 10 works will remain permanently in the Beaufort Sculpture Park, which already includes over 30 works from the past triennials.

New 'Family-friendly' brochure

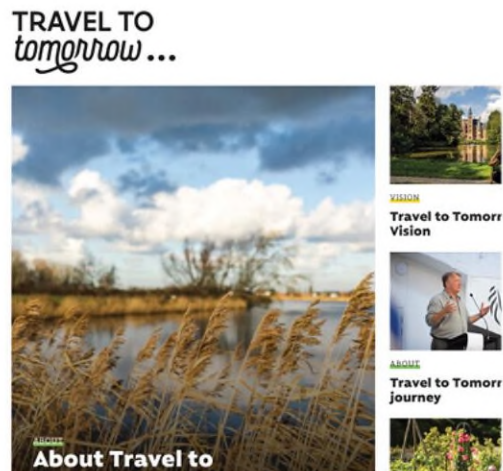


In Flanders, families will find the best conditions for a relaxing and varied stay - this is shown in our freshly updated brochure with numerous tips and information.
