UNDERSTANDING BARRIERS IN US-KOREA TRADE PRACTICES

As economic tensions and strategic competition reshape the Indo-Pacific, concerns have grown regarding South Korea's use of nontariff trade barriers that result in preferential treatment of domestic firms. Critics have long argued that South Korea maintains a range of measures that disadvantage firms from the United States, including opaque regulatory processes and inconsistent enforcement of rules.

The House Judiciary Committee has just published a report titled "Closed for Competition: South Korea's Discriminatory Attacks on American-owned Businesses" that examines these practices in detail and how they impact U.S. firms including in the context of the Korea Trade and Investment deal signed in November.
