LAW OFFICE OF BART S. FISHER

SEPTEMBER 2016

Ending date: Until now, I had been led to believe that my representation of Suriname would continue beyond September 30, 2016. No extension of the representation agreement has been proffered, however, and no work has been assigned since September 2016. Future representation of Suriname is uncertain at this point.

Item 7: See above explanation of date of termination.

Item 11: During this 4 month reporting period, have you engaged in any activities for or rendered any services to any foreign principal named in items 7, 8, or 9 of this statement?

Acting under a FARA license granted to the Law Office of Bart S. Fisher, I performed the following services on behalf of the Embassy of Sudan:

1. I provided legal advice on possible techniques to obtain debt forgiveness from external creditors for Sudan.
2. I provided legal advice on possible cooperation between the Johns Hopkins University (JHU) Bloomberg School of Public Health Administration and the University of Gezira, and Dr. Taha Taha, Professor at the JHU Bloomberg School of Public Health Administration.
3. I provided legal advice related to an agreement between the University of Khartoum and Johns Hopkins University intended to accomplish the following:
 - (a) permit the exchange of faculty and students from the University of Khartoum and Johns Hopkins University;
 - (b) provide for cooperation on archaeological projects in Sudan, including the restoration of the pyramids in Meroe, Sudan; and
 - (c) organize an exhibition in the United States of artifacts from the Sudan National Museum and other potential suppliers. I participated in meetings

planning this exhibition with the Ambassador Maowia Khalid of the Embassy of Sudan, Dr. Betsy Bryan, Alexander Badawy Professor of Egyptian Art and Archaeology, Johns Hopkins University, and Douglas Comer, Principal, Cultural Site Research and Management and President, International Scientific Committee on Archaeological Heritage Management.

4. I advised Sudan on a strategy to present a legal challenge to the U.S. sanctions regime against Sudan and the U.S. Department of State listing of Sudan as a State Sponsor of Terrorism.
5. I provided legal advice with respect to the requirements of the U.S. Department of Commerce for licenses to export spare parts for Sudan Airways civil aircraft.
6. I provided legal advice with respect to efforts to obtain a license from the Office of Foreign Assets Control for spare parts for Sudan Railways.
7. I participated in an interview of the Foreign Minister of Sudan Ibrahim Ghandour with Zachary Warmbrodt, reporter for Politico, on June 10, 2016.
8. I prepared a memorandum for the Embassy of Sudan on a program of Young Professionals in Foreign Affairs on the enforcement of U.S. sanctions held on September 8, 2016, at the Hogan Lovells law firm.
9. I advised Sudan on the application of the Sudanese Sanctions Regulations to contacts with think tanks such as the Atlantic Council, the Woodrow Wilson Center for International Scholars, the Cato Institute, the Council on Foreign Relations, The Century Foundation, the Osgood Center for International Studies, and the Brookings Institution. I met with Shelton Williams, President, the Osgood Center for International Studies, Peter Pham, Director of the Africa Center, Atlantic Council, Michael Van Dusen, Consultant at the Woodrow Wilson Center for International Scholars, and Doug Bandow, Senior Fellow, the Cato Institute.

Acting under a FARA license granted to the Law Office of Bart S. Fisher, I performed the following services on behalf of the Ministry of Natural Resources of the Republic of Suriname:

1. I provided legal counsel and advice with regard to the transfer of assets in the bauxite and alumina sectors of Suriname from Alcoa and its Suriname affiliate Suralco to Monaco Resources Group (MRG).
2. I drafted a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between MRG and the Ministry of Natural Resources of Suriname.
3. I contacted Klaus Kleinfeld, Chairman and CEO of Alcoa, on June 7, to discuss the terms and conditions of Alcoa's exit from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.
4. I contacted Michelle O'Neill, Vice President for Government Affairs and Trade Policy of Alcoa, on June 7, 9, and 17, and August 18, to seek a meeting to discuss the terms and conditions of Alcoa's exit from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.
5. I contacted Audrey Strauss, Chief Legal Officer, Alcoa, through emails sent by me to Nick Akerman, partner, Dorsey & Whitney, on July 22 and July 25, to discuss a mutually beneficial process of the transfer of the facilities, assets, and liabilities of Alcoa from Suriname.
6. I provided legal advice with regard to the application of the U.S. Foreign Corrupt Practices Act to the activities of Alcoa in Suriname, including oral advice and preparation of memoranda.
7. I provided legal advice with regard to criteria to be used in the selection of an advisory committee on the Suriname bauxite and alumina industry for the Government of Suriname.
8. I participated in numerous discussions with personnel from MRG, including a meeting with Fabrice Viguier on October 3 and a conference call with Mr. Viguier on November 2, to discuss strategies for dealing with Alcoa with regard to its exit from Suriname.
9. I participated in numerous discussions with Jennifer Geerlings-Simons, Speaker of the National Assembly of Suriname. We discussed the plans of Alcoa for its exit from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.

- 2. I distributed informational materials on May 10, 2016, to Carlo Munoz, Military Affairs Correspondent, The Washington Times. Those materials were forwarded to the Registration Unit on May 10, 2016.**

In my capacity as Managing Partner of the Law Office of Bart S. Fisher, I engaged in the following political activities for the Republic of Suriname:

- 1. I provided political advice to Regilio Dodson, Minister of Natural Resources of the Republic of Suriname.**
- 2. I met with the U.S. Ambassador to Suriname, Edwin R. Nolan, to discuss the terms and conditions of Alcoa's exit from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.**
- 3. I prepared briefing materials on June 24 for Mark Walker, Staff Director of the Western Hemisphere Subcommittee of the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the U. S. House of Representatives, and Thomas Alexander, Chief Counsel of the House Foreign Affairs for investigations. These materials related to Alcoa's departure from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname, and the economic condition of those industries.**
- 4. I met on October 26 with Mark Walker, Staff Director of the Western Hemisphere Subcommittee of the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the U.S. House of Representatives. We discussed contacts with Alcoa personnel regarding Alcoa's exit from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.**
- 5. I met on November 14 at the U.S. Department of State with Brad Freden, Director of Caribbean Affairs, and Jamie O'Mealia, Desk Officer for Suriname. I briefed them on the status of Alcoa's departure from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.**

6. I participated in a teleconference on July 14 with Viviana Bovo, Senior Advisor for Western Hemisphere Affairs, office of Sen. Marco Rubio (R-Florida). I briefed her on the status of Alcoa's departure from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.
7. I have had numerous discussions with Jennifer Geerlings-Simon, Speaker of the National Assembly of the Republic of Suriname. We discussed the role of the National Assembly in negotiations regarding the departure of Alcoa from the alumina and bauxite industries of Suriname.
8. I prepared memoranda and informational materials on August 23 and August 29 for Len Boselovic, reporter for the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, regarding the behavior of Alcoa/Suralco in Suriname. Those materials were forwarded to the Registration Unit on August 23 and August 29.
