Participated in meetings on this subject with the Sudan Minister of Finance & National Economy, Bader Eldlin Mahmmoud Abbas Mukhtar, and the Governor of the Central Bank of Sudan, Abdelrahman Hassan Abdelrahman Hassan, in Washington, D.C., on April 18, 2016.
2. Provided legal advice on possible cooperation between the Johns Hopkins University (JHU) Bloomberg School of Public Health Administration and the University of Gezira. Participated in a meeting on this subject on March 31, 2016, with Taha Taha, Professor at the JHU Bloomberg School of Public Health Administration.
3. Provided legal advice on a series of projects that are intended to do the following:
 - (a) Permit the exchange of faculty and students of the University of Khartoum and Johns Hopkins University;
 - (b) provide for cooperation on archaeological projects in Sudan, including the restoration of the pyramids in Meroe, Sudan; and
 - (c) organize an exhibition in the United States of artifacts from the Sudan National Museum and other potential suppliers; and
 - (d) participated in meetings on the proposed artifacts exhibition with Ambassador Maowia Khalid of the Embassy of Sudan, with Professor Betsy Bryan of Johns Hopkins University, and with Douglas Comer, who is the Principal of Cultural Site Research and Management and the President of the International Scientific Committee on Archaeological Heritage Management.

4. Advised Sudan on a strategy to present a legal challenge to the U.S. sanctions regime against Sudan and to the U.S. State Department listing of Sudan as a State Sponsor of Terrorism.
5. Provided legal advice on the application of the Sudanese Sanctions Regulations to a contract between the Republic of Sudan and Alstom, a subsidiary of the General Electric Company.
6. Provided legal advice with respect to the licensing requirements of the U.S. Department of Commerce for exporting spare parts for Sudanese civil aircraft.
