

FRAMEWORK FOR STABILIZATION AND RENEWAL IN HAITI

CORE PRINCIPLES



Priority 1: Reestablishing Security

The Gang Suppression Force (GSF) should be fully operationalized with sufficient staffing, mandate, and funding to conduct intelligence-driven operations that reclaim territory, secure infrastructure and key roads, dismantle organized crime networks, and engage communities transparently to rebuild public trust and strengthen state authority.

SECURITY, JUSTICE AND PREVENTION OF NEW VIOLENCE

GSF and PNH operations should be paired with a DDR process that distinguishes violent actors from coerced participants and offers reintegration pathways, while conducting rapid surveys in liberated areas, supporting grassroots organizations for survivors of gender-based violence, and linking security gains to justice and accountability to prevent relapse into violence.



Priority 2: Supporting Displaced Families

As security improves, tens of thousands will return to neighborhoods with destroyed homes, looted assets, and damaged infrastructure, making it essential to match violence reduction with visible improvements in daily life, prioritizing early recovery in key economic corridors, strategic neighborhoods, and essential infrastructure.

COMMUNITY-LED QUICK-IMPACT INITIATIVES

- Form local rehabilitation committees.
- Use cash-for-work crews for cleanup and repairs.
- Provide starter bundles and reactivation kits.
- Restore services with emergency and long-term solutions.
- Promote local laws and avoid past mistakes.



Priority 3: Conditions for Long-Term Stability

SECURING THE PATH TO ELECTIONS

- Reorient political dialogue around a realistic electoral calendar and establish a technocratic transition focused on impartial, feasible elections and essential state functions with civic oversight.

GOVERNANCE AND JUSTICE REFORM

- Use secure digital systems, transparency measures, hybrid justice mechanisms, and mobile courts to strengthen oversight, fight corruption, and reinforce rule of law.

REFORMING THE SECURITY ARCHITECTURE

- Strengthen security by reforming the police, transforming the Armed Forces, empowering the CNSD, and building regional alliances against crime.

RESTARTING ECONOMIC ACTIVITY AND JOB CREATION

- Strengthen borders, improve competitiveness, mobilize reconstruction financing, invest in national infrastructure, and redesign the tax system to support development and growth.

ROLE OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND INTERNATIONAL PARTNERS

- Support the private sector in creating jobs and prosperity through security, rule of law, infrastructure, capital, public investment, technology, and long-term international support.
