## "Google Warns China Is Ramping Up Cyberattacks Against Taiwan"

- **Increasing Cyberattacks on Taiwan:** Google has reported a significant rise in Chinese cyberattacks targeting Taiwan in the last six months, focusing on various sectors, including defense, government, and private industry.
- **Advanced Hacking Techniques:** Chinese hackers are using sophisticated tactics to mask their activities. These include compromising small internet routers in homes and offices to launch attacks while hiding their origin.
- **Multiple Hacking Groups:** Over 100 hacking groups from China are being tracked by Google, reflecting the scale and intensity of the cyber threat against Taiwan.
- **Taiwan's Response:** Taiwanese President Tsai Ing-wen acknowledges the threats, including military intimidation and cyberattacks, and emphasizes Taiwan's efforts to bolster defense capabilities and societal resilience.

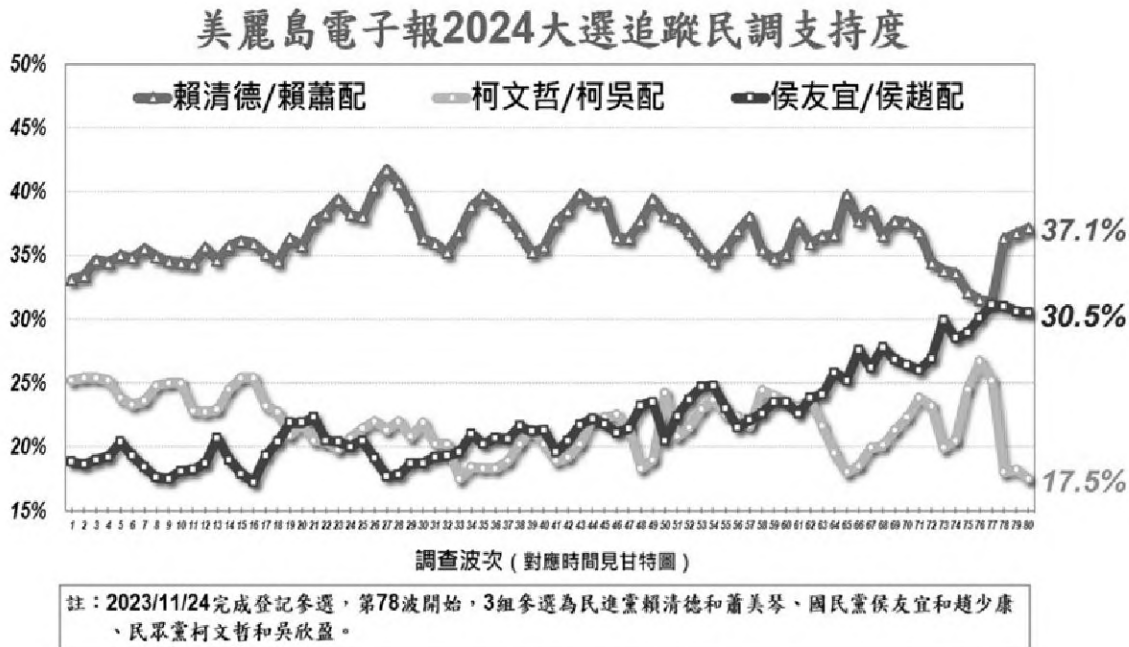
## My-Formosa Poll: 2024 Presidential Election Poll from Nov. 28 to Nov. 30 (Dec. 1, 2023)

- In the My-Formosa Poll conducted from November 28 to November 30, Lai Ching-Te of the Democratic Progressive Party (DPP) leads with 37.1%, followed by Hou Yu-Ih of the Kuomintang (KMT) at 30.5%, and Ko Wen-Je of the Taiwan People's Party (TPP) at 17.5%.
- The poll, which was conducted through Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI), successfully interviewed 1,348 people with a

maximum sampling error of  $\pm 2.7\%$  at a 95% confidence level, ensuring its representation of the general population's demographics and characteristics.

- This poll is one of the Taiwanese media's most cited polls, highlighting its credibility and significance in the political landscape.
