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President Trump Thanks President Tinubu for Protecting Christians

Professional activists and a minority in Congress are actively working to undermine the U.S.–Nigeria counterterrorism partnership.

In case they missed it, President Trump just made his position crystal clear— once again.

In a letter to Nigeria's President Tinubu, President Trump [personally thanked](#) Nigeria's leader for his decisive leadership on the security surge and his efforts to protect Christians. The letter follows joint [U.S.–Nigeria airstrikes](#)—on Christmas Day and again this May—that eliminated ISIS's global number-two leader and more than 200 ISIS fighters.

Yet the activists press on, pushing [narratives](#) designed to undermine joint counterterrorism operations and fracture the country.

Some of these voices happen to be self-proclaimed Trump supporters, some elected members of the President's own party. So why do they keep repeating claims that contradict U.S. intelligence assessments, contradict the results of joint counterterrorism operations, and now contradict President Trump's own words?

The gap is impossible to ignore.

On one side: the [reality on the ground](#), successful joint operations, and a robust security surge protecting Christians in the North Central States.

On the other: a story about a [phantom](#), all-powerful "Fulani Ethnic Militia" that the U.S. Commission on International Religious Freedom and U.S. State Department say [doesn't exist](#) or the fake Jos attack that never happened.

Now that President Trump has put his position in writing, it's fair to ask a few questions.

To Congressman Riley Moore, Congressman Greg Steube, Congressman Chris Smith, Congressman John James, Congressman Chip Roy, Senator Ted Cruz, former Senator Sam Brownback, former Ambassador Tibor Nagy, Nina Shea of the Hudson Institute, Dede Laugesen, Derek Vanbuskirk, and the rest of the professional activist class:

How do you respond to President Trump's letter?

Do you believe the President is lying—or being deceived?

And if neither, what explains your refusal to update your claims in the face of so much evidence to the contrary?

We suggest you give the President's letter a careful read and be honest about the work being done to protect Nigerian Christians and Nigerians of all faiths.

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
