In order to support general bilateral relations, Scribe Strategies & Advisors will research, assess, and analyze issues of concern to Uganda; advise Uganda on U.S. policies, activities in Congress and the Executive Branch, and developments with regard to U.S. Africa policy; and maintain contact, as necessary, with Members of Congress and their staff members, Executive Branch officials, members of the news media, businesses, and non-governmental organizations (NGOs, including think tanks and academic institutions).

Scribe Strategies & Advisors will provide strategic advice to the principal on strengthening Uganda's general bilateral relations with the United States, its government, and institutions. Scribe will also assist in communicating priority issues in the United States-Uganda bilateral relationship to relevant U.S. audiences, including the U.S. Congress, Executive Branch, news media, businesses, and policy community (including think tanks, advocacy groups, and academic institutions).

Scribe will also provide strategic counsel and assistance to the Ugandan Foreign Minister in his role as President of the United Nations General Assembly.

Time Based Contract

This Agreement is made the ^{15th} day of the month of June 2015, between **The Government of the Republic of Uganda** represented by **Ministry of Foreign Affairs**, of P.O. Box 7048 Kampala (hereinafter called the "Procuring and Disposing Entity") and **M/S SCRIBES STRATEGIES & ADVISORS** of 1215 -17th street, N.W. Annex, Fifth Floor Washington, DC 20036 (hereinafter called the "Provider").

WHEREAS

- (a) the Procuring and Disposing Entity has requested the Provider to provide certain services (hereinafter called the "Services") as defined herein and attached to this Contract;
- (b) the Provider having represented to the Procuring and Disposing Entity that it has the required skills, personnel and technical resources, has agreed to provide the Services on the terms and conditions set forth in this Contract;

NOW THEREFORE the parties hereto hereby agree as follows:

1. In this Agreement words and expressions shall have the same meanings as are respectively assigned to them in the Contract referred to.
2. In consideration of the payments to be made by the Procuring and Disposing Entity to the Provider as indicated in this Agreement, the Provider hereby covenants with the Procuring and Disposing Entity to provide the Services in conformity in all respects with the provisions of the Contract.
3. The Procuring and Disposing Entity hereby covenants to pay the Provider in consideration of the provision of the Services, the Contract Price of **USD 250,000 (United States Dollars Two Hundred Fifty Thousand)**, exclusive of reimbursable or such other sum as may become payable under the provisions of the Contract at the times and in the manner prescribed by the Contract.
