**Item 11:** During this 6-month reporting period, have you engaged in any activities for or rendered any services to any foreign principal named in items 7, 8, or 9 of this statement?

Acting under FARA licenses granted to the Law Office of Bart S. Fisher and Omni Advisors, I performed the following services on behalf of the Embassy of Sudan:

1. Provided legal advice on possible techniques to obtain debt forgiveness from external creditors for Sudan, including meeting with the Sudan Minister of Finance & National Economy Bader Eldlin Mahmmoud Abbas Mukhtar and Richard Rahn, economic consultant, on October 7, 2016. I met in Dubai on February 25, 2017, and February 26, 2017, with Jon Cimino, Chairman, The Dubai Group, regarding debt relief for Sudan and possible rescheduling of the foreign debt of Sudan;
2. Provided legal advice on possible cooperation among the Johns Hopkins University (JHU) Bloomberg School of Public Health Administration, the University of Gezira, and Dr. Taha Taha, Professor at the JHU Bloomberg School of Public Health Administration. The focus of this cooperation is on the training of doctors and nurses, and on the establishment of appropriate clinical trials for Sudan.
3. Provided legal advice related to an agreement between the University of Khartoum and Johns Hopkins University intended to accomplish the following:
  - (a) permit the exchange of faculty and students from the University of Khartoum and Johns Hopkins University;
  - (b) provide for cooperation on archaeological projects in Sudan, including the restoration of the pyramids in Meroe, Sudan;
  - (c) organize an exhibition in the United States of artifacts from the Sudan National Museum and other potential suppliers. I participated in meetings planning this exhibition with Ambassador Maowia Khalid of the Embassy of Sudan, Dr. Betsy Bryan, Alexander Badawy Professor of Egyptian Art and Archaeology, Johns Hopkins University, and Douglas Comer, Principal, Cultural Site Research and Management and President, International Scientific Committee on Archaeological Heritage Management. These meetings included one on October 25, 2016, with Douglas Comer and Jake Comer to discuss the details of the Meroe project.
4. Advised Sudan on a strategy to present a legal challenge to the U.S. sanctions regime against Sudan and the U.S. Department of State listing of Sudan as a State Sponsor of Terrorism.
5. Provided legal advice with respect to the requirements of the U.S. Department of Commerce for licenses to export spare parts for Sudan Airways civil aircraft.

6. Provided legal advice with respect to efforts to obtain a license from the Office of Foreign Assets Control for spare parts for Sudan Railways.
7. Assisted the Osgood Center for International Studies in organizing a program at the National Press Club on October 25, 2016, featuring as speakers Mrs. Khadiga Abu Al Gasim Hag Hamed and Ahmed Badawi, to address the impact of U.S. sanctions against Sudan on women's and children's welfare in Sudan.
8. Worked with the Embassy of Sudan in making arrangements for a trip to Sudan by Carlo Munoz, National Security Correspondent for The Washington Times.
9. Advised Sudan on the application of the Sudanese Sanctions Regulations to contacts with think tanks such as the Atlantic Council, the Woodrow Wilson Center for International Scholars, the Cato Institute, the Council on Foreign Relations, The Century Foundation, the Osgood Center for International Studies, and The Brookings Institution. Briefed Doug Bandow, Senior Fellow, Cato Institute, on January 14, 2017, on the relief from OFAC sanctions announced on January 13, 2017.
10. Attended meeting at the Embassy of Sudan on February 6, 2017, with Peter Watson, Chairman of the Dwight Group, regarding debt relief for Sudan and developing the energy industry of Sudan.
11. Attended meeting at the Embassy of Sudan on February 14, 2017, with Douglas Comer regarding opportunities for Sudan in its hotel and tourism sector.

Acting under a FARA license granted to the Law Office of Bart S. Fisher, I performed the following services on behalf of the Ministry of Natural Resources of the Republic of Suriname:

1. Provided legal counsel and advice with regard to the possible transfer of assets in the bauxite and alumina sectors of Suriname from Alcoa and its Suriname affiliate Suralco to Monaco Resources Group (MRG).
2. Provided legal advice with regard to the application of the U.S. Foreign Corrupt Practices Act to the activities of Alcoa in Suriname, including oral advice and preparation of memoranda.
3. Provided legal advice with regard to criteria to be used in the selection of an advisory committee on the Suriname bauxite and alumina industry for the Government of Suriname.
4. Participated in numerous discussions with personnel from MRG, including a meeting with Fabrice Viguier on October 3, 2016, and a conference call with Mr. Viguier on November 2, 2016, to discuss strategies for dealing with Alcoa with regard to its exit from Suriname.
