

Registrant worked to arrange future engagements with Members of Congress and their staffs to discuss matters related to the foreign principal's economy, the expansion of financial services opportunities in the broader Caribbean region, bilateral trade, and on issues mutually relevant to the U.S. government and the foreign principal.
Government of Bermuda	Registrant generally counseled the foreign principal around its economic issues, as well as its bilateral relationship with and the state of affairs within the United States. Registrant interacted with Members of Congress, their staffs, and other policymakers on the foreign principal's behalf. Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago	Regarding its representation of the foreign principal, Registrant engaged in contacts and political activities concerning matters of interest to the foreign principal during the reporting period. Registrant more broadly counseled the foreign principal on the state of affairs in the U.S., evolving public developments around the federal government, and identified strategies and engagement opportunities to enhance the bilateral relationship between the foreign principal and the U.S. Registrant generally advised the foreign principal in achieving economic diversification via potential investments and other partnership opportunities. Registrant also continued to communicate and meet with Executive Branch and Legislative officials key to strengthening the U.S.- Trinidad and Tobago economic and security bilateral relationship. This included communicating with Administration officials and with Members of Congress and their staffs, issues affecting the broader Caribbean region, developments in Venezuela, energy security matters, bilateral trade, and the foreign principal's economic diversification. Moreover, Registrant also continued to discuss with the foreign principal the U.S.'s national security interests and related matters.
Embassy of Japan	Registrant engaged in activities concerning matters of interest to the foreign principal during the reporting period. Registrant more broadly counseled the foreign principal on the state of affairs in the U.S., evolving public developments around the federal government, and identified strategies and engagement opportunities to enhance the bilateral relationship between the foreign principal and the U.S. Registrant monitored Executive and Legislative Branch activities to identify opportunities to strengthen the U.S.- Japan bilateral relationship.
Co-operative Republic of Guyana	Registrant engaged in activities and strategic discussions concerning matters of interest to the foreign principal during the reporting period.
