BELGRADE - At a meeting with Serbian PM Ana Brnabic on Thursday, ambassadors of the Quint states said judicial reforms put up for a referendum in Serbia were major steps in strengthening judicial independence and advancing the rule of law in the country.

The ambassadors of France, Italy, Germany and the US and the charges d'affaires of the UK and the EU Delegation to Serbia said this was "also important in the context of Serbia's commitments in the EU accession process."

Brnabic said Serbia had made major progress on the rule of law and that constitutional amendments were the most significant reform in that field, the government press service said in a statement.

"The partners from the Quint highlighted the significance of the rule of law and called for further progress on the judicial reform," the statement also said.

Brnabic said she was dissatisfied with the refusal of the provisional Pristina institutions to allow the holding of the referendum in the territory of Kosovo-Metohija.
