MMGY Global will cooperate with the Suruga Marketing & Tourism Bureau to provide tourism promotion and marketing services in the United States based on the terms and conditions provided by Suruga Marketing & Tourism Bureau to MMGY Global. The scope of work will include the below activities:

Scope of Work:

- Tour development project
 - To follow previous successes of the PARU-Suruga tour, we will manage a tour development project with Janelle Cook / Purposeful Travel to support an on-demand tea tour for the clientele of an Atlanta-based tea shop.
 - MMGY will liaise between Janelle / Purposeful Travel and the Atlanta tea shop owner, similar to previous efforts with Amy Truong / PARU.
 - If a fam trip is arranged for the tea shop owner, MMGY will support the organization efforts as required by Visit Suruga.
- Travel advisor FAM Trip (Joint with MLIT Chubu)
 - Conduct a familiarization (FAM) trip for product managers and/or travel advisors who are partnered with or work for tour operators and host agencies which are suitable for Suruga's distribution efforts. Tactics will focus on exposing attendees to first-person experiences in Suruga, encouraging sales of the tour operators' products and expansion to selling more of the region.
 - Encourage trade media coverage to generate travel advisor awareness and future bookings to Suruga.
 - Quotation below includes expended costs for up to six attendees. Costs include tentative amounts for international airfare (2pax), accommodation(4pax), ground transportation(4pax), meals and activities(4pax). MMGY recommends 1 Suruga host, 1 trade media attendee and 2 product managers and/or travel advisors.
 - Potential opportunity to work exclusively with Avanti Destinations to invite Avanti product manager and travel advisors associated with Avanti in order to build upon existing marketing work with the operator. In partnership with Avanti, it's likely that they would require all attendees to cover the costs of their own flights, allowing us to reallocate budget to other activities if requested.



- In-person travel advisor event attendance and management
 - Management of application, planning and attendance at in-person travel advisor educational events including the following:
 - San Diego PATA Japan event – April
 - Japan Showcase events 2025/2026 (locations and dates TBC)
 - MMGY will apply to all events that interest Suruga; acceptance is dependent on the JNTO.
