Privacy Act Statement. The filing of this document is required for the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, 22 U.S.C. § 611 *et seq.*, for the purposes of registration under the Act and public disclosure. Provision of the information requested is mandatory, and failure to provide the information is subject to the penalty and enforcement provisions established in Section 8 of the Act. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the Registration Unit in Washington, DC. Working Plan

Development of a resolution by the United States Senate supporting the convening of an international donor conference for the Regional Government of Kurdistan, and to undertake efforts to insure passage of the resolution by the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and Senate as a whole.

Activities:

- Drafting of language of the resolution based on content found through our research that will be most politically favorable to both parties in the Senate with input from representative of the Kurdish Regional Government to call for a convening of an international donor conference in support of the Kurdistan Region of Iraq's humanitarian challenges.
- Identifying Members of the Senate who will serve as sponsors of the resolution
- Directly contacting the Senate leadership and potential sponsors to provide copies of our most desirable resolution draft language
- Working directly with Senate majority and minority leadership staff and staff of the Foreign Relations Committee to refine resolution language
- Directly contacting offices of each Committee member to gauge support or resistance to the resolution
- Maintaining continuous communication with representatives of the Kurdish Regional Government to insure seamless coordination of information and updates on the resolution's progress
