




## UAE Aid Global Response

### Sudan

For the last five years, from 2019 to 2024, the UAE's foreign assistance to Sudan amounted to USD 1.89 billion, of which USD 290.0 million, or 15 percent, went to humanitarian assistance.

A recent conflict broke out between the Sudanese Armed Forces and the Rapid Support Forces in April 2023, which created massive displacement. In response to the conflict, the UAE contributed throughout the last year USD 230 million in humanitarian assistance to support internally displaced people in Sudan and Sudanese refugees who fled to neighboring countries. This humanitarian assistance breakdown as follows:

 **159** aircraft transported humanitarian assistance.

140 airbridges to Chad  
18 airbridges to Sudan  
1 airbridges to South Sudan



**2** UAE field hospitals constructed in Amdjarass and Abeche, Chad.

**24,741** cases received in Amdjarass field hospital.

**21,761** cases received in Abeche field hospital.



**1,000** solar lights installed for the city and main roads in Chad.



**1** ship to Sudan



**3** schools rehabilitated in Chad.



**10,000** total tons of food, medical aid and other relief items.



**5** water wells constructed in Chad.



USD **230** million, including the USD 100 million pledged at the Paris pledging conference.

During Paris Donor Conference in April 2024, the UAE pledged USD 100 million, to be implemented as follows:

- USD 70 million in cooperation with the UN Organizations, in Sudan (USD 60 million) and in South Sudan (USD 10 million), as follows:

- Providing USD 30 million directly through the UAE aid team to support the Sudanese refugees in the neighboring countries of Chad, Uganda and Ethiopia.






## UAE Aid Global Response

### Ukraine


After the onset of the Russian-Ukrainian conflict, the UAE allocated USD 105 million in foreign assistance to support the Humanitarian efforts.


#### UAE's Humanitarian Assistance to Ukraine Crisis:

 **14** aircraft transported humanitarian assistance.


 **7,500** laptop and **10,000** school bags to support the education process in Ukraine


 **50** ambulance vehicles.

 **2** ships dispatched to Romania.

 **4,520** electricity generators to meet the harsh winter weather conditions and power outages.

 Dubai International Humanitarian City transported **125** tons of relief items and medical aid via 2 aircraft of the working UN organizations in the country.

 **1,015.3** tons of food, medical aid and relief items sent to Ukraine, included 1.25 LED lights.

 Support to the Ukrainian refugees in Moldova, Poland and Bulgaria




### Afghanistan


For the last five years, the UAE's foreign assistance to Afghanistan amounted to USD 186.2 million, of which USD 172.0 million, or 92 percent, went to humanitarian assistance.

Afghanistan faced the 2022 floods and the subsequent earthquakes in 2022 and 2023, and the UAE swiftly and proactively responded. It provided essential resources such as food, health care, shelter, and non-food items, constructed field hospitals, and sent medical teams, demonstrating its commitment to the well-being of the Afghan people in times of need.

#### Humanitarian Assistance to Afghanistan for the last five years:

 **36** aircraft transported humanitarian assistance.

 **922.2** tons of food, medical supplies, tents and other relief items.

 **2** field hospitals were constructed in Khost and Herat provinces during the 2022 and 2023 Afghanistan earthquakes.










## UAE Aid Global Response


### Somalia

For the last five years, the UAE's foreign assistance to Somalia amounted USD 210.0 million, of which USD 39.0 million, or 19 percent, went to humanitarian assistance.

For decades, Somalia has been experiencing frequent droughts which are becoming more severe as the climate changes, resulting in a critical food crisis. For the last five years, the UAE contributed USD 34.7 million worth of food assistance and other relief supplies to people affected by drought in Somalia.

#### Humanitarian Assistance to Somalia for the last five years:

-  **12,200** tons of food aid shipped in response to drought crisis.
-  **420,300** food parcels distributed to people affected by drought.
-  **USD 34.7** million in response to natural disasters.
-  **50** tons of food aid in response to floods.
-  **1,000** tents provided.
-  **USD 3.6** million in response to COVID-19

 The opening of Sheikh Zayed Hospital in Mogadishu, which includes 8 main departments: Emergency and general surgery, internal medicine, pediatrics, dentistry, gynaecology and obstetrics, dermatology, ENT and radiology with ultrasound and X-ray equipment, in addition to other critical departments.








### Kenya

For the last five years, the UAE's foreign assistance to Kenya amounted to USD 50.7 million, of which USD 9.6 million, or 19 percent, went to humanitarian assistance.

In May 2024, Kenya experienced heavy rains and floods, which resulted in the loss of many lives, property, and service disruption. In response to the natural disaster, the UAE allocated USD 15 million and dispatched five aircraft carrying 200 tons of relief aid, including essential food supplies and medical equipment.

#### Humanitarian Assistance to Kenya for the last five years:

-  **5** aircraft transported humanitarian assistance.
-  **200** tons of relief aid, including essential food supplies and medical equipment.
-  **USD 4.8** million in response to natural disasters.
-  Currently, the second phase of the Early Recovery Support Programmes after the floods is being implemented.
-  **USD 3.8** million in response to COVID-19
