3. What types of platforms exist (platforms for work, housing/lodging, mobility, agriculture, industrial applications, etc.)?
4. What is the relationship between "artificial intelligence" and platforms?

Main text of the paper:

5. What legal questions does the platform economy raise?
6. What political and economic questions does the platform economy raise?
7. What relevant regulation already exists? At what levels (e.g., local, national, supranational)?
8. What calls and proposals for regulation of the platform economy have been made? Who is making these suggestions and with what arguments are they being advanced?
9. From a trade union perspective, what are the most important legal, political, and economic questions raised by the platform economy and what needs to be regulated?
10. What initiatives and proposals can trade unions support?
11. What can trade unions do themselves in this area?
