We appreciated the time to catch up last week- clearly we share a lot of common work streams! Below are several items to follow up on.

- JBS: As we noted, NWF has significant expertise on Latin American cattle and JBS but here is some intel that you may already be aware of:
 - Chain Reaction Research [has several reports](#) assessing JBS's deforestation exposure
 - Our Rapid Response satellite [reports](#) highlight recent cases of deforestation linked to JBS, with the [2019 summary](#) available here
 - [FAIRR](#) has done some good analyses
 - [The Guardian](#) has covered JBS's various illegal deforestation and corruption scandals
- Tyson: [here is our statement](#), urging Tyson to report on progress it is making towards its 2 million acre sustainability commitment. Our full set of asks for Tyson is at the end of our report, [here](#). Walmart of course plays an important role in evaluating and advancing Tyson's sustainable feed sourcing commitments as a supplier, so we are very interested in how your team is approaching the engagement and the expectations you have for Tyson.
- Cargill: We didn't get to discuss Cargill too in depth on the call, but they are [a core focus](#) of both our U.S. agriculture and Latin America advocacy efforts given their enormous market influence and sustainability practices that significantly lag market expectations.

We would welcome the opportunity for a follow up call to dig into some of these items deeper- particularly for Tyson and Cargill. Is there a time next week that works for you?
