Thank you for the information. I will review it with my team and get back to you shortly. A couple points of clarification as we begin our work together:

1. When you say “when we established a business relationship with this producer, our due diligence did not find indication of illegal activity. We will review the situation if future negotiations take place” does this mean you no longer have a relationship or source from this producer?
2. I also wanted to clarify what is meant by “we will review the situation.” What verification methods does Cargill use to validate filed grievances?
3. Is Cargill only applying its deforestation-free policy to direct suppliers and only to illegal deforestation?
