Registrant is filing this Registration at the instruction of the Department of Justice. There is no specific effective date of agreement with foreign principal as required by Item 7 above. Registrant took his first meeting with the principal in mid-February 2019.

Registrant's work on behalf of the Principal did not result from any formal written contract, exchange of correspondence, or specific verbal communications resulting in an agreement or understanding between the Registrant and the Foreign Principal.
