Greetings sir. Our firm has contracted to do some short-term work for the government of Alberta, Canada (hence the disclosure below). As you know, the Keystone XL pipeline was nixed by the president yesterday, and Biden's first foreign call tomorrow is with PM Trudeau. Sadly, **it is an insult directed at the United States' most important ally and trading partner on day one of a new administration.** Today, as I speak, **over two thousand women and men have lost their jobs**, are heading home from good-paying union jobs, as a result of this decision."
