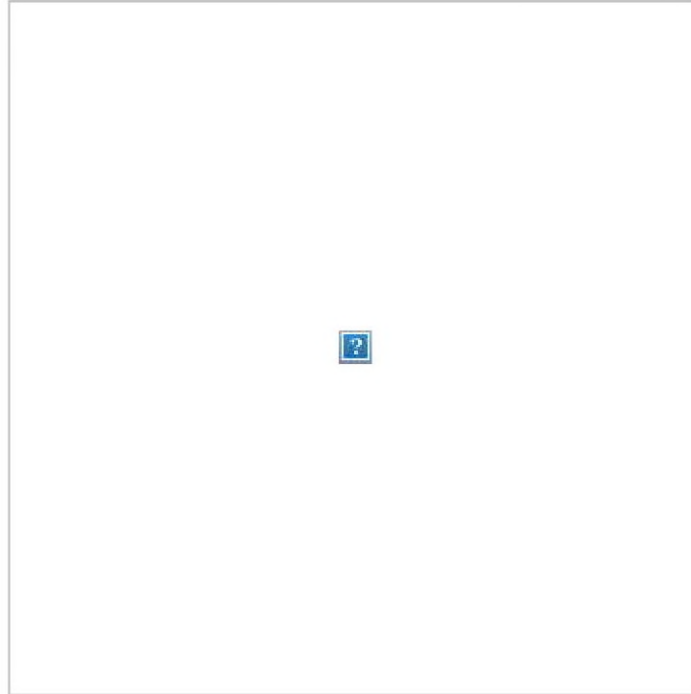
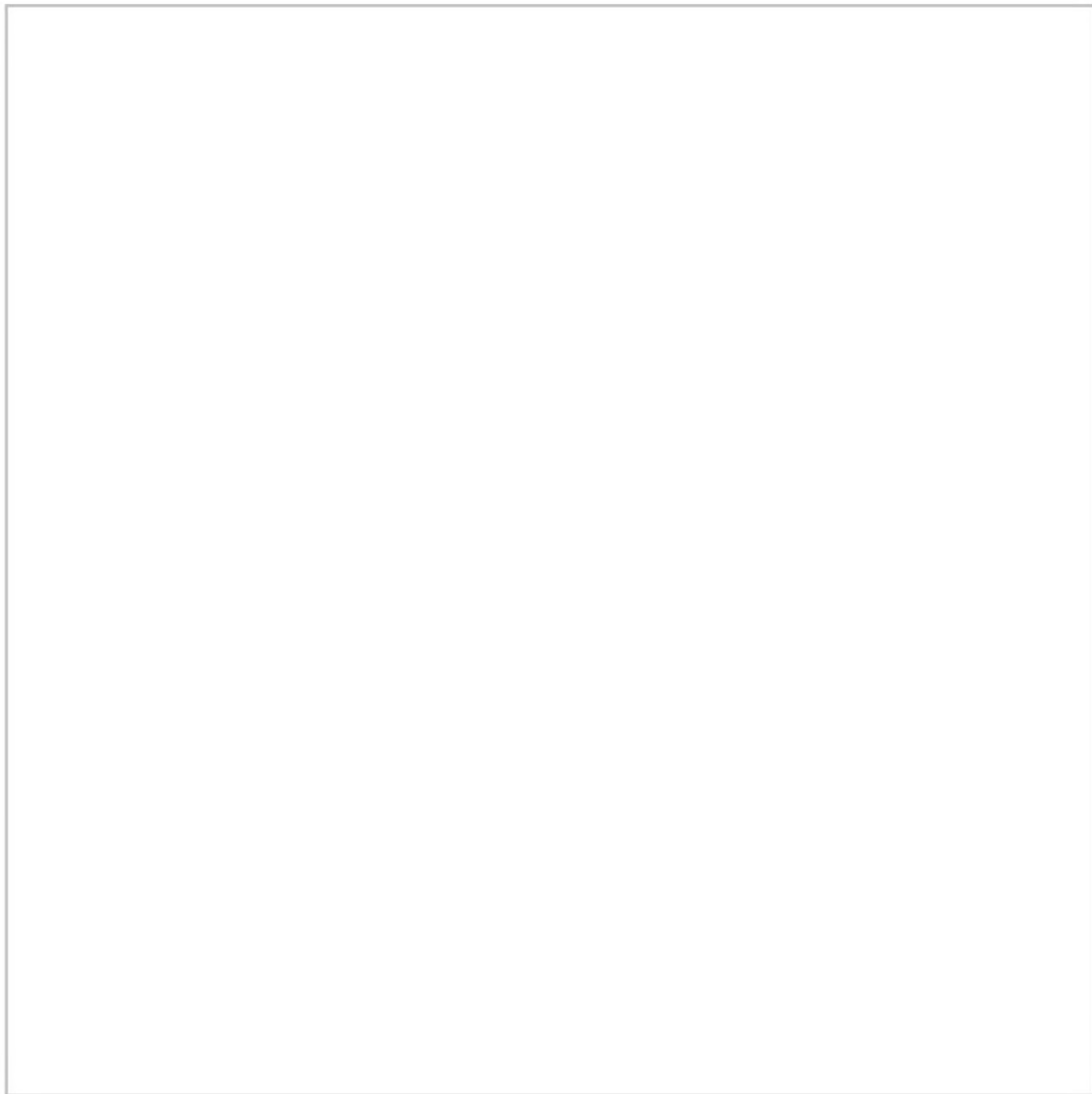

Meet the Speakers

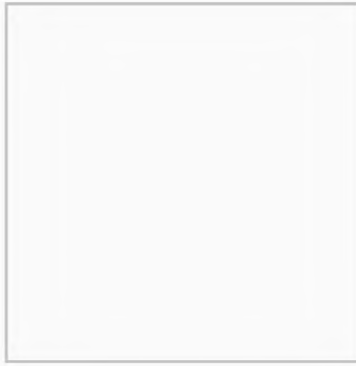
