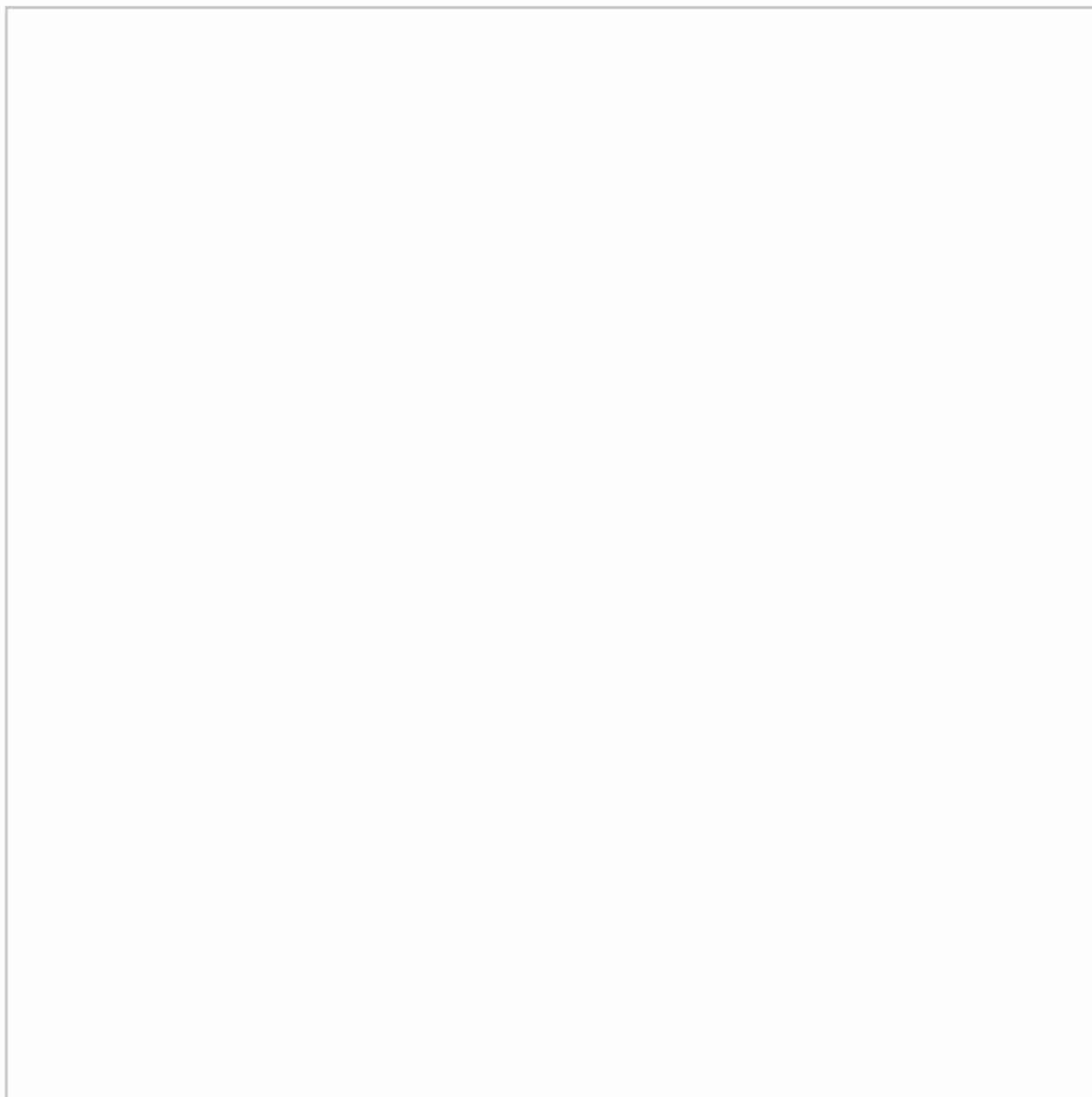

New Office Space in VA**

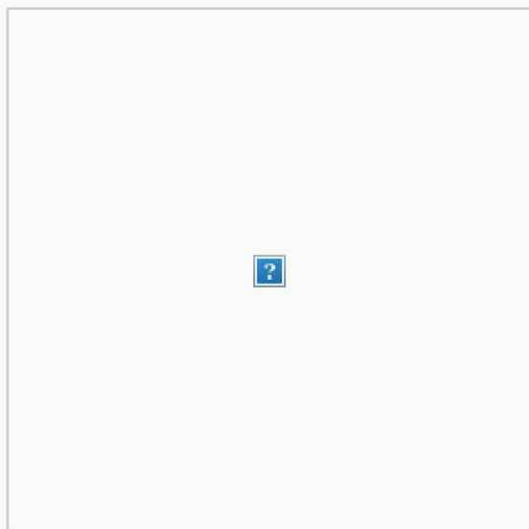

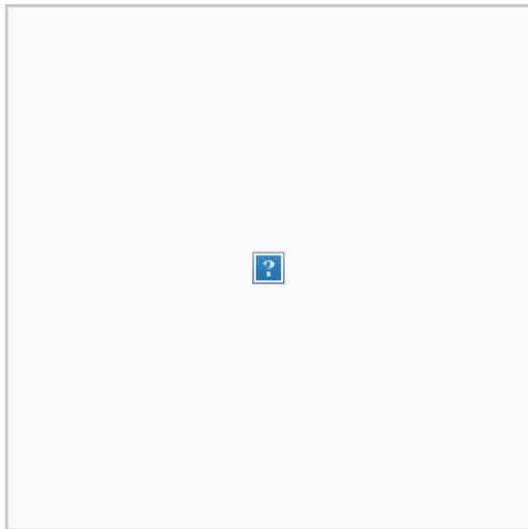
Supreme Court Strikes Down Trump Tariffs

The Representative of German Industry & Trade reported that, in a 6-3 ruling, the Supreme Court invalidated President Donald Trump's former broad use of tariffs imposed under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act. The majority concluded that the 1977 statute does not empower a president to levy import taxes across most global trading partners. The Court emphasized that Congress—not the Executive Branch—holds explicit authority over tariffs under Article I. In dissent, Justices Clarence Thomas, Samuel Alito, and Brett Kavanaugh argued that the law afforded greater discretion in emergencies. The decision ultimately reinforces judicial limits on presidential power when economic policy actions lack clear congressional authorization.

ESTA Proposals under

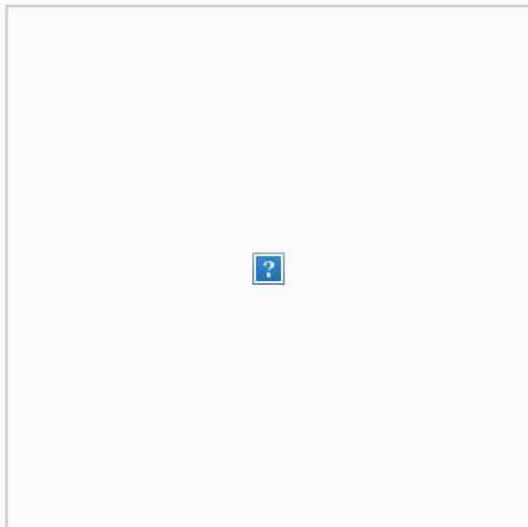


Consideration

Recent proposals to the Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA) framework suggest significant expansion on how identities of the Visa Waiver Program travelers are verified, with stronger enhancements in biometrics and digital identity verification. Measures under consideration include shifting ESTA submissions to a mobile-app-based process, requiring real-time selfie capture that is matched against passport chip data, and collecting broader personal information such as social media accounts, contact details, and selected family data. The biometric scope would extend beyond facial recognition to potentially include fingerprints and iris scans, while genetic data is referenced only as a theoretical future option rather than an active requirement. It is important to note that the ESTA proposal is not yet a final rule.

Infrastructure Expansion Continues in the U.S.

U.S. infrastructure activity is expected to keep expanding even as the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act winds down at the end of 2026 and no successor program is in place. Although the early momentum from the \$550 billion package is fading and real civil-engineering output dipped slightly in 2025, analysts see this as a temporary pause rather than a structural slowdown. Overall, despite political headwinds and protectionist rules, U.S. infrastructure expansion is set to continue and still offers opportunities for both domestic and foreign firms.
