In a 6-3 ruling, the Supreme Court of the United States ruled that tariffs imposed under the International Emergency Economic Powers Act ([hashtag#IEEPA](#)) are unlawful and unconstitutional.

DGIC Business Partner **Barnes & Thornburg LLP** highlighted key takeaways from this ruling:

- The Court did not address refunds or the impact on recent trade arrangements with partners like the EU and Japan
- Tariffs under Section 232 (steel, aluminum, autos) and Section 301 (China) remain untouched
- The path to refunds is unclear—while Donald Trump stated the government will litigate the issue, prior filings suggested refunds could follow an adverse ruling
