NRF Battlefield Operations

In the month of July 2024, the National Resistance Front (NRF) of Afghanistan executed 44 meticulously planned operations against Taliban forces across Afghanistan, resulting in 76 Taliban terrorists killed and 56 wounded. These operations, spanning 11 provinces, marked the most active month since the start of the spring offensives, with more attacks and a broader geographic focus. The NRF targeted key Taliban personnel and positions, eliminating high-ranking officials such as Hafiz Abdul Bari Chakansori in Nimroz and Mullah Shir Ahmad in Farah. Several operations specifically targeted Taliban commanders known for torturing prisoners and harassing the local population.

The NRF continued to employ unconventional guerrilla warfare tactics, primarily hit-and-run attacks designed to weaken the enemy, accumulate resources, and prepare for an eventual transition to conventional warfare. This month, several operations extended beyond initial strikes, with clashes lasting up to 30 minutes and in one instance, up to two hours. These prolonged engagements demonstrated the NRF's growing ability to sustain combat and inflict significant damage on Taliban forces. Most of the NRF's attacks occurred during the night, leveraging the cover of darkness for tactical advantage and to minimize civilian casualties. There were, however, a few highly planned daytime operations executed with the utmost care to avoid collateral damage and ensure the safety of non-combatants. This month, besides seizing enemy weaponry, the NRF also destroyed critical Taliban weaponry stations, strategically depleting enemy resources and setting the stage for future large-scale operations aimed at liberating provinces.

On July 1, 2024, NRF forces launched a decisive attack on the entrance gate of the Kabul military airport, adjacent to the Taliban's Ministry of Interior. The operation, conducted at 8:20 PM, resulted in the deaths of three terrorists, injuries to two others, and the destruction of a Taliban vehicle.

August 6, 2024

On July 1, 2024, NRF forces conducted an attack in District 12 of Herat city, targeting Taliban terrorists from the Herat Border Brigade. The operation, carried out at 8:30 PM, resulted in the deaths of two terrorists.

On July 3, 2024, NRF forces attacked Taliban terrorists patrolling in the Zulfikar School alley in Kabul city's sixth security district. The operation, conducted at 8:35 PM, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and the wounding of another.

On July 3, 2024, NRF forces carried out a targeted operation in the 17th security district of Kabul city, successfully eliminating a Taliban post commander. The operation, conducted at 8:30 p.m., also resulted in the wounding of two other terrorists.

On July 4, 2024, NRF forces executed a targeted operation in the vicinity of the second district of Nimroz city, Nimroz province. The operation, which took place at 3:40 PM, successfully eliminated Hafiz Abdul Bari Chakansori, a member of the Taliban's Internal Security Command. Additionally, the enemy's weapons were seized by the NRF freedom fighters.

On July 4, 2024, NRF forces attacked a Taliban checkpoint at "Dahan Dara Kalten" in the Nurgram district of Nuristan province. The operation, conducted at 9:10 p.m., resulted in the death of one terrorist and injuries to two others.

On July 5, 2024, NRF forces launched an attack at the "Entrance Gate" of the 16th security district in Kabul city. The operation, conducted at 8:30 p.m., resulted in the killing of three terrorists and the injury of two others.

On July 6, 2024, NRF forces conducted two separate operations in the provinces of Farah and Nimroz, targeting Taliban terrorists. The first operation took place at 7:40 PM in the fifth district of Farah city, where NRF forces killed Mullah Shir Ahmad, a member of the Taliban's operational unit, and seized the group's weaponry.

On July 6, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation in the fifth district of Farah city, targeting Taliban terrorists, at 7:40 p.m. This attack resulted in the death of Mullah Shir Ahmad, a member of the Taliban's operational unit, and the capture of the group's weaponry by NRF forces.

On July 6, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation in the first district of Zaranj city, the capital of Nimroz province at 10:45 p.m. This attack resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist from the border unit and severe injuries to another.

August 6, 2024

On July 7, 2024, NRF forces attacked Taliban terrorists in the ninth district of Herat city at 8:50 p.m., resulting in the deaths of two terrorists and the wounding of another, while also capturing enemy weaponry.

On July 7, 2024, NRF forces conducted an attack against Taliban terrorists in front of the "Pakhteh" company in the Guzara district of Herat province. The operation, carried out at 8:40 p.m., resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists.

On July 7, 2024, NRF forces attacked a Taliban checkpoint in the "Dahan Korgal" area of the Duab district in Nuristan province. The operation, conducted at around 11:00 p.m., resulted in the death of one terrorist and injuries to two others.

On July 8, 2024, NRF forces targeted Taliban terrorists at the checkpoint (entrance gate) of the Police Township in the fourth district of Kabul city. The operation, carried out at 8:25 p.m., resulted in the death of one terrorist and the wounding of another.

On July 10, 2024, NRF forces attacked Taliban terrorists in the vicinity of the fifteenth security district of Herat city. The operation, conducted at 7:20 p.m., resulted in the deaths of two terrorists and the wounding of another.

On July 11, 2024, NRF forces targeted a Taliban patrol vehicle on the Bagrami road in the twelfth district of Kabul city. The operation, conducted at 8:50 p.m., resulted in the death of one terrorist and injuries to two others.

On July 11, 2024, NRF forces launched a multi-directional offensive on the district center of "Doab" in Nuristan province at around 12:00 a.m. This strategic operation resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist, injuries to two others, and the destruction of an enemy vehicle. The clash persisted for several hours, during which NRF freedom fighters inflicted casualties on the enemy before safely returning to their positions.

On July 11, 2024, NRF forces attacked the entrance checkpoint of the district police command in Rustaq, Takhar province. The operation, conducted at 8:30 p.m., resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to three others.

On July 12, 2024, NRF forces conducted an offensive operation against the Taliban's police headquarters in the Shahada district of Badakhshan province. The operation, which took place at 9:20 p.m., resulted in the death of one terrorist and the wounding of another.

August 6, 2024

On July 12, 2024, NRF forces conducted a targeted operation at a special battalion post in "Yaftal Bala" of Badakhshan province at 7:40 p.m. This assault resulted in the deaths of two terrorists, including a commander, and the wounding of another.

On July 12, 2024, NRF forces attacked a Taliban militia patrol vehicle in the Chinki area of Seyyed Khel district, Parwan province, at 11:20 p.m. The operation led to the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to two others.

On July 14, 2024, NRF forces attacked Taliban terrorists patrolling on a motorcycle in the "Hada Ghazni" area of the fifth security district of Kabul. The operation, conducted at 8:20 p.m., resulted in the deaths of two Taliban intelligence members and the complete destruction of their motorcycle.

On July 14, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation in the vicinity of Bala Murghab district, Badghis province. The attack, which occurred at 10:20 p.m., targeted the Taliban terrorist group, resulting in the deaths of two of their intelligence members, including the deputy head of the intelligence department for the Bala Murghab district, and injuries to two other members.

On July 15, 2024, NRF forces attacked the entrance gate of the provincial building in Badghis. The operation, conducted at 9:45 a.m., resulted in the deaths of the head of administration and finance of the province and three of his associates. Additionally, two other terrorists were wounded.

On July 15, 2024, NRF forces conducted a targeted operation in the Jabraili township of Herat city's 13th security district at around 10 a.m. The operation led to the elimination of a Taliban commander from the second battalion of their border brigade, along with his two guards. Additionally, NRF freedom fighters seized three enemy weapons and destroyed a military vehicle.

On July 15, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation in the Chikal area of Charikar city, the center of Parwan province, at 7:45 p.m. The targeted attack on an enemy checkpoint resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and the wounding of two others.

On July 15, 2024, NRF forces carried out an operation in the Hesa Awal district of Kapisa province at 9:00 p.m. The attack targeted one of the enemy's bases, resulting in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and the wounding of another. Additionally, a Humvee tank belonging to the enemy was destroyed during this operation.

August 6, 2024

On July 18, 2024, NRF forces executed a precise operation in Hussainabad village, just behind the Herat Directorate of Refugees, at 7:25 p.m. The operation targeted a Taliban patrol vehicle, resulting in the deaths of Qari Ebadullah Hamza, the head of the 12th District Intelligence, and an associate. Additionally, another member of the group was wounded in the attack.

On July 18, 2024, NRF forces attacked an enemy base located in the Chinese camp in the Ghowrmach district of Badghis province. The operation, conducted at 9:45 p.m., targeted the base where the 4th Brigade of the Herat Corps was stationed. As a result, a Taliban commander named Mawlawi Mohammad Hesam and two of his guards were killed, and another terrorist was wounded.

On July 21, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban checkpoint in the Qala-e Haidar Khan area of the 13th security district in Kabul city. The operation, carried out at around 8:00 p.m., resulted in the death of the checkpoint commander and the wounding of another terrorist.

On July 22, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation at a Taliban checkpoint in the village of Khwaja Ghar in the Pachghan Valley, part of the Nijrab district in Kapisa province, at 10 p.m. The attack resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and the wounding of another.

On July 23, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation against a Taliban patrol vehicle in the Shaheed Square area, a few hundred meters away from the Ministry of Interior in the 15th security district of Kabul city. This targeted assault, which occurred at 8 p.m., resulted in the deaths of three enemy members and injuries to two others.

On July 23, 2024, NRF forces conducted a precision operation in the Doshi district of Baghlan province, targeting a Taliban stronghold. The assault successfully eliminated Mawlawi Qasim, a unit leader, and his associate, Qari Noorulrahman Saeed, both members of the third battalion of the fourth brigade of the Omari Corps. Additionally, two other terrorists were wounded, and a substantial cache of enemy weapons and ammunition was destroyed.

On July 24, 2024, NRF forces ambushed a Taliban patrol in the Qala Dasht Tapa Nasiri area of Kabul, resulting in the deaths of two terrorists, Qari Hayatullah and Safar Khan, and the wounding of Qari Asif Jalali. The operation was conducted at 1:00 a.m., targeting enemy movements effectively.

August 6, 2024

On July 25, 2024, NRF forces conducted an ambush in the Qala-e-Ahmad Khan area of the Bagrami district, Kabul province. The operation, carried out at around 9 p.m., targeted two Taliban terrorists on a motorcycle, resulting in their elimination. Additionally, the motorcycle used by the terrorists was destroyed.

On July 26, 2024, NRF forces attacked Taliban terrorists in the Dolina district of Ghor province. The operation, conducted at around 10 a.m., resulted in the elimination of two Taliban terrorists and the seizure of two enemy weapons.

On July 26, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation in the Khost district of Baghlan province, targeting Taliban terrorists. The operation, conducted last night, resulted in the death of a Taliban unit commander named Qari Mukhtar and the injuries of two of his companions.

On July 26, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban checkpoint in District 15 of Herat city. The operation, carried out at around 8 p.m. on Shahid Alawalddin Road in the area of the former 17th Division, resulted in the death of a Taliban intelligence officer and injuries to two other Taliban terrorists.

On July 27, 2024, NRF forces conducted a targeted operation in the village of Suleimanabad, on the Islam Qala-Herat road. The operation, carried out at 5:30 a.m., targeted a vehicle carrying the Chief of Staff of the Taliban's Border Battalion. As a result, Maulvi Nisar Ahmad Omari, the Chief of Staff of the Seventh Battalion of the Fourth Border Brigade, and Hafiz Ehsanullah Haqqani, the Deputy Commander of the battalion, were killed. Additionally, two other terrorists were wounded.

On July 27, 2024, NRF forces attacked a Taliban patrol vehicle in the Qala-e-Sahra area of Jabal-e-Siraj district, Parwan province. The operation, conducted at around 8 p.m., resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and the wounding of another. Among those killed was Rahim Gul, a member of the Highway Brigade responsible for coordinating patrol units.

On July 28, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban outpost in the village of Kalalan Ashtargaram, within the Hesa Awal Kohistan district of Kapisa province. The operation, carried out at around 1:00 a.m., resulted in the death of a Taliban terrorist named Mullah Qasim and the wounding of two other terrorists.

August 6, 2024

On July 29, 2024, NRF forces launched a precise operation in the Qala Wali Valley of Ghormach district, Badghis province, at 12:30 p.m. The assault resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists, including Mullah Abdul Rauf, a member of the Taliban's internal security, and the wounding of Mullah Sayed Gul, a member of the Taliban's criminal division. Another terrorist was also wounded in the attack.

On July 29, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation in Kabul city, targeting a patrol vehicle of Taliban terrorists in the Qala-e-Ghaibi area of Chehelsetoon, within the seventh security district. The operation, which took place around 7 p.m., resulted in the death of Qari Alam Jan, the commander of the "block" of the seventh district, and the wounding of three of his forces.

On July 30, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation in the Lab-e-Jar area of the 15th security district in Kabul city. The operation, carried out at 8:20 p.m., targeted a Taliban terrorist militia checkpoint, resulting in the deaths of two Taliban members and the injury of another.

August 6, 2024

NRF Foreign Relations

Ali Maisam Nazary, NRF's head of foreign relations took part in the NATO Forum in Washington, D.C from July 9–July 11. The 2024 Washington conference was a meeting of NATO countries, their non NATO allies, think tanks, and academic institutions. A session at NATO's Forum was held titled, "Addressing the Evolving Threat of Terrorism." Relevant to the evolving threat of terrorism, the NRF has continuously warned the world against the expansion of nearly 20 terrorist groups under Taliban rule in Afghanistan.



On July 13th, the head of foreign relations of the National Resistance Front issued a statement condemning the heinous assassination attempt on former President Donald Trump during his presidential campaign in Pennsylvania.

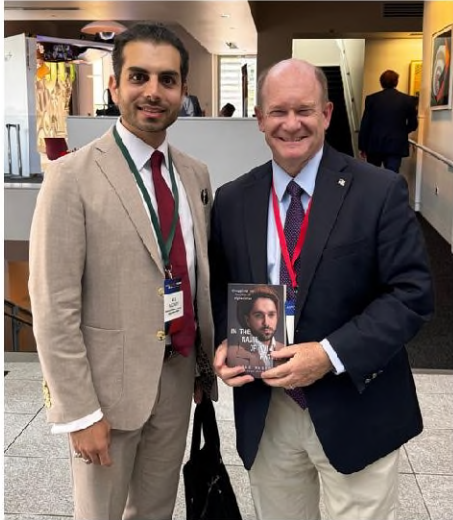

August 6, 2024

The NRF attended the 15th annual Aspen Security Forum from July 16–19. This important conference brought together political leaders and government officials, activists, intellectuals, renowned journalists, civil society members and key figures from around the world to discuss the most pressing global issues. The NRF head of foreign relations conveyed the message of Afghanistan's resistance to many influential figures on the sidelines of this four-day conference.



On July 26th, the National Resistance Front of Afghanistan extended a statement of gratitude to Congresswoman Nancy Mace for her commendable efforts in signing a new bill to designate the Taliban as a terrorist organization in the United States. "This initiative is crucial for global security and the wellbeing of all, and we urge everyone with a conscience to support it."

NRF in the Media

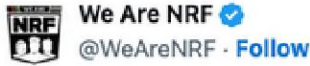
On July 16th, the interview of the leader of the National Resistance Front commander Ahmad Massoud, was released on the Shawn Ryan Show. In this episode, a range of critical topics were discussed starting with the stark warning of imminent attacks on US soil, and why Afghanistan has become a prominent training ground for terrorists with 21 active terrorist groups operating within its borders. Also discussed was the staggering \$2.5 billion income the Taliban generates annually under the pretense of NGO's, including funding from the Biden administration that ranges from \$40-87 million a week. Garnering over 1 million views on multiple platforms, host Shawn Ryan described the interview with commander Massoud as "a monumental guest whose presence marks one of the most significant interviews we've ever conducted."




Also on July 16th, a significant petition to invite Commander Ahmad Massoud in front of Congress to testify and cease the funding to the Taliban was also initiated by Shawn Ryan. This petition supporting the National Resistance Front of Afghanistan marks a historic milestone in Afghanistan's modern history, garnering over 200,000 signatures abroad for continuing the global war on terror. The NRF foreign relations expressed gratitude in a post for this call to action, stating "no petition about Afghanistan even reached 10,000 signatures in the past. We are optimistic that with the backing of the American public, this petition will bring an end to funding for the Taliban terrorist group. Thank you for standing with us in our struggle for freedom and justice in Afghanistan."

Taliban Human Rights Violations

On July 1st, 2024, the Taliban provincial director of the Propagation of Virtue in Kandahar, Abdulhai Omari, mandated that journalists and media workers grow beards and wear turbans. He described the media and journalists as "sources of moral corruption" and stressed on the need for their reformation, instructing media officials that "broadcasting women's voices is completely forbidden and should not be aired in any program."

On July 2nd, the Taliban announced that 18 individuals will be publicly flogged at the stadium of Uruzgan's province capital, Tarinkot. In a post on X social media platform, the Taliban governor's office called on the public to attend the scene to witness the punishment of these individuals, while warning that bringing any kind of phone or camera to the flogging site is "strictly prohibited."

On July 4th, the Taliban's Supreme Court announced that five people in Kandahar province have been punished with 30 lashes for sexual relations followed by imprisonment. One person in Ghazni was given 39 lashes for theft and sentenced to one year and six months of imprisonment, while the Taliban publicly flogged 21 people in Panjshir, Badghis, and Uruzgan provinces two days prior. Public corporal punishment and no due process has faced widespread criticism from human rights organizations.

On July 5th, the Taliban's Ministry of Justice closed down a Shia mosque in Kabul, citing the government ownership of the mosque's land. Taliban forces stormed the Bab-ul-Hawaij Mosque during evening prayers, evicting worshippers and sealing the entrance doors. Several worshippers and local residents who protested against the Taliban's actions were detained and taken to an unknown location.

On July 6th, Taliban fighters conducted house-to-house searches in several areas of western Kabul. Sources stated that the Taliban have been forcibly entering homes without female officers, conducting ransack-style searches.

On July 7th, Noor Ahmad Agha, a military commander of the Taliban, was appointed as the governor of Afghanistan's central bank. Noor Ahmad Agha was known as the "financier of bomb-making," designated as an international terrorist by the United States and under sanctions by the UN and EU.

FURTHER CONFIRMED ATROCITIES

July 17th

After over a week of the Taliban's harassment and crackdown on Ashura ceremonies throughout Afghanistan, the UN human rights special rapporteur called on ensuring religious freedom for the Shia population. On the same day, the Taliban's Foreign Minister, strongly criticized UN reports that claim Afghanistan has become a haven for terrorism and is witnessing widespread human rights violations; dismissing these reports as "baseless" and "nonsense."

July 22nd

The Taliban's Ministry of Justice again excluded women in the third round of Bar exams in Kabul for issuing work permits to Afghans hoping to become lawyers. Since the Taliban took control of Afghanistan in August 2021, this is the third year when the Bar exam has been held without the participation of Afghan women, while girls are still banned from school beyond 6th grade..

July 28th

On July 28th, the body of a former local police officer named Rae's was discovered in Samkani district of Paktia province after he was arrested by the Taliban from his home two weeks ago. Relatives confirmed that the arrest was made forcibly at gunpoint, with no information about his whereabouts or health condition. Rae had served as a local police officer in the former Ministry of Interior. His family reported that he died under Taliban torture from the wounds and bruises on his body.
