Battlefield Operations

In November 2024, the National Resistance Front of Afghanistan carried out 29 operations across eight provinces: Kabul, Herat, Badghis, Kapisa, Parwan, Kunduz, Badakhshan, and Farah. These operations resulted in the killing of 63 Taliban terrorists and the injuries to 41 more, along with the destruction of five Taliban vehicles and the seizure of 28 firearms and several communication devices. The attacks included 7 ambushes, 12 targeted strikes on checkpoints, and 10 precision operations on Taliban command centers, patrols, and intelligence facilities. Five operations were conducted within a single 24-hour period, reflecting the NRF's operational consistency and capacity to engage in multiple locations simultaneously. Notable operations included the elimination of three Taliban intelligence operatives in Kunduz during a strike on the Taliban's main intelligence headquarters on November 16, and the targeted killing of the finance officer of the Al-Farooq Corps' First Battalion during a strike in Guzara district, Herat, on November 5. Other key engagements, such as the November 7 attack in Kote Sangi, Kabul, destroyed two Taliban vehicles and neutralized five Taliban personnel, while a coordinated ambush on the Herat-Badghis highway on November 6 disrupted Taliban movements in the region.

Taliban Human Rights Violations

December 09, 2024

The NRF's operations this month demonstrated a clear focus on disrupting Taliban logistics and targeting key figures and positions. Ambushes on enemy patrols and convoys, such as those in Herat, Kabul, and Badakhshan, accounted for a significant proportion of the casualties. Precision strikes in Baghlan and Parwan further weakened Taliban infrastructure, including the destruction of their intelligence coordination center in Nahrin district on November 2. In addition to neutralizing Taliban combatants, the NRF also seized weapons and equipment critical for sustaining operations. These efforts align with the NRF's ongoing strategy of unconventional warfare while gradually preparing for a transition to conventional operations aimed at liberating territories under Taliban control. The increasing frequency and coordination of these attacks, particularly in regions such as Kabul, Herat, and Badghis, indicate a deliberate and focused approach to weakening Taliban influence across Afghanistan.

On November 2, 2024, NRF forces launched a targeted operation in Nahrin district, Baghlan province. The operation, conducted at 1:35 AM, targeted the Taliban's intelligence coordination center and the district police command, resulting in the deaths of three Taliban terrorists, including a member of their intelligence division, and injuries to two other intelligence operatives. The rocket strike destroyed the intelligence coordination building, an enemy security post, and a Taliban vehicle.

On November 5, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in the Farah Rud area of Farah province. The operation, carried out at 7:00 PM along the highway, resulted in the elimination of two Taliban terrorists belonging to the Highway Battalion of the Third Brigade under the Al-Farooq Corps. NRF forces also seized one enemy firearm during the engagement.

On November 5, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in the Guzara district of Herat province. The operation, conducted at 7:30 PM in the Kamarband area near Ziarat-Jah, resulted in the elimination of three Taliban terrorists, including the finance officer of the First Battalion of the First Brigade under the Al-Farooq Corps. During the operation, NRF forces seized three enemy firearms.

On November 5, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting Taliban positions in the Qala Salari area of Qarabagh district, Kabul province. The attack, conducted at approximately 8:30 PM, resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to two others. NRF forces also seized one enemy weapon during the operation.

On November 6, 2024, NRF forces successfully ambushed a group of Taliban terrorists traveling along the Herat-Badghis highway. The operation, conducted at approximately 5:30 PM in the Band Sabzak area, resulted in the elimination of two Taliban terrorists and injuries to two others from the Al-Farooq Corps' Highway Battalion.

December 09, 2024

On November 6, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting a Taliban checkpoint in the 17th Security District of Kabul. The operation, conducted at 5:45 PM along the Kabul-North Highway near the power junction in the Kotal Khairkhana area, resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to two others. The operation was carried out without causing harm to civilians or NRF forces.

On November 7, 2024, NRF forces launched a targeted operation against a convoy of Taliban special units in the Fifth Security District of Kabul. The attack, conducted at 6:20 PM near the Ariana Kabul Hotel in the Kote Sangi area, resulted in the deaths of five Taliban terrorists and injuries to four others. NRF forces destroyed two Taliban military vehicles and seized five enemy weapons during the operation.

On November 7, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in Badakhshan province. The operation, conducted at 2:30 AM, resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to another.

On November 9, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in the 11th district of Herat province. The attack, carried out in the Shaidayee area, resulted in the deaths of three Taliban terrorists and injuries to another. During the operation, NRF forces successfully seized an enemy weapon.

On November 9, 2024, NRF forces conducted an ambush targeting Taliban operatives in Bagram district, Parwan province. The operation, carried out in the village of Ez Bashi, resulted in the elimination of two Taliban terrorists. This strategic ambush neutralized threats along a route frequently used by enemy personnel in the area.

On November 13, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting a Taliban checkpoint in Jwand district, Badghis province. The attack resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist from the 4th Battalion of the 3rd Brigade under the Al-Farooq Corps. During the operation, NRF forces seized an enemy weapon.

On November 14, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting Taliban terrorists near the Charsu roundabout on the Herat-Kandahar highway in Guzara district, Herat province. The operation, conducted close to the airport, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists who were known for harassing and oppressing local civilians.

On November 14, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban patrol in Guzara district, Herat province. This attack resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists involved in oppressive activities against local civilians.

On November 15, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting a Taliban mobile checkpoint in the 8th Security District of Kabul. The operation resulted in the deaths of three Taliban terrorists and injuries to two others. The attack successfully disrupted enemy activities along the road in this district.

December 09, 2024

On November 15, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in the Pul-e-Matak area of Jabal al-Saraj district, Parwan province. This attack resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to another. During the operation, NRF forces seized one enemy firearm.

On November 15, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in Hesa Duwum Kohistan district, Kapisa province. This operation targeted members of the Taliban's Second Brigade of the Aftab Division and resulted in the elimination of two Taliban terrorists. NRF forces also seized one enemy firearm during the attack.

On November 15, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban patrol in Kishm district, Badakhshan province. This attack resulted in injuries to two Taliban terrorists.

On November 15, 2024, NRF forces carried out an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in Argo district, Badakhshan province. The engagement led to the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to another.

On November 16, 2024, NRF forces launched a targeted operation against the main intelligence headquarters of the Taliban in Kunduz city. The operation, conducted at 7:45 PM on Kunduz Road, resulted in the deaths of three Taliban terrorists and injuries to two others. During the engagement, NRF forces also destroyed a Taliban vehicle and inflicted significant damage on the group's operational infrastructure.

On November 17, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban patrol in the 12th Security District of Kabul city. The operation, carried out at 7:30 PM, resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to another. NRF forces executed the attack without sustaining any casualties.

On November 17, 2024, NRF forces conducted an ambush targeting Taliban terrorists on the Islam Qala highway in Herat province. The operation, carried out at 8:00 PM, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and injuries to another. The targeted individuals were members of the second battalion of the first border brigade under the Al-Farooq Corps. During the ambush, NRF forces seized one enemy weapon.

On November 22, 2024, NRF forces conducted an ambush targeting Taliban operatives in the First Security District of Kabul city. The attack, carried out at 10:00 AM in the Bala Hissar area, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban intelligence operatives. NRF forces seized two enemy firearms and a communication device during the operation.

On November 22, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting a Taliban patrol in Nijrab district, Kapisa province. The attack resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to two others, all of whom were members of the Taliban's intelligence unit.

December 09, 2024

On November 24, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban patrol in Shakardara district, Kabul province. The attack resulted in the death of one Taliban terrorist and injuries to two others, all members of the Taliban's First Brigade under the Central Corps. During the operation, NRF forces seized one enemy firearm.

On November 27, 2024, NRF forces launched an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in Guzara district, Herat province. The attack, conducted around 7:00 PM in the Dasht-e-Yalan area, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and injuries to another. The targeted individuals were members of the First Brigade under the Al-Farooq Corps. NRF forces also seized two enemy firearms during the operation.

On November 28, 2024, NRF forces conducted a targeted operation against a Taliban checkpoint near the Continental Hotel in Kabul's Second Security District. The operation, carried out at 6:25 PM, resulted in the deaths of three Taliban terrorists and injuries to two others. The checkpoint personnel were known for harassing and mistreating local residents.

On November 28, 2024, NRF forces launched a targeted operation against a Taliban checkpoint in the 17th Security District of Kabul city. The attack, conducted at 7:00 PM near the checkpoint of the Directorate of Petroleum in the Sar-e-Kotal Khairkhana area, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and injuries to two others. The operation was executed without causing harm to NRF forces or civilians.

On November 28, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting Taliban terrorists in the Qala Dasht-e-Payeen area of Shakardara district, Kabul province. The attack, carried out around 8:00 PM, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and injuries to another. The targeted individuals were members of the Taliban's First Brigade under the Central Corps. During the operation, NRF forces seized two enemy firearms.

On November 30, 2024, NRF forces conducted an operation targeting a Taliban checkpoint in Mir Bacha Kot district, Kabul province. The attack, carried out around 9:00 PM along the Kabul-Parwan highway, resulted in the deaths of two Taliban terrorists and injuries to another.

December 09, 2024

Foreign Relations

On November 3rd, David Sproule—Canada’s Special Representative for Afghanistan—announced that Canada supports the political stance of the National Resistance Front of Afghanistan, after condemning the Taliban’s latest rollback of women’s rights. Appreciation of this stance was stated by the NRF Head of Foreign Relations, Ali Nazary: “We extend our gratitude to Ambassador David Sproule for his support of the National Resistance Front of Afghanistan’s political platform. The NRF is committed to building a democratic and pluralistic Afghanistan for all its citizens, and support from friends like Canada is vital to this mission.”

On November 6th, the NRF Head of Foreign Relations posted a congratulatory statement to the winner of the United States election, President Donald Trump. On November 11th and 12th, the NRF also posted congratulatory statements on President Trump’s security team appointments, Congressman Mike Waltz as National Security Advisor, and Senator Marco Rubio as Secretary of State.

Taliban Human Rights Violations

November of 2024 marked another month in Afghanistan where the situation is dire, as the Taliban have only worsened in their extremist ideology while coordinating with other terrorist groups and consolidating their system of gender apartheid. With the suppression and censorship of free media in Afghanistan and the world's attention towards other conflicts, the Taliban terrorist regime continues to violate human rights and international law with impunity.

On November 3rd, the Taliban banned all forms of photography and filming at the journalism faculty of Sheikh Zayed University in Khost province.

On November 3rd, a 55-year-old woman named Gul Bibi died in the hospital in Darda, Takhar province after being severely beaten by a local Taliban commander for resisting to give up her property in a land dispute.

On November 5th, the Taliban announced that they publicly flogged more than 40 people across five provinces on charges ranging from running away from home, to extramarital relations, without due process.

On November 15th, Reporters Without Borders (RSF) stated that the Taliban has intensified their repression of the media and the persecution of journalists. "Since returning to power in August 2021, the Taliban has brutally suppressed the Afghan media, stifled independent voices and plunged the country into a silence of fear," said Célia Mercier, head of RSF's South Asia unit.

On November 18th, the Guardian published an investigative report on the Taliban's destruction of thousands of homes in mainly Hazara and Tajik-populated areas of Kabul as a catastrophic purge with an "ethnic motive." According to the report, the Taliban's "renovation program" in Kabul has left thousands of people homeless and an area of about 385 hectares has been destroyed.

On November 21st, the Taliban banned the broadcast of images of living creatures in Kunar Province. The Taliban governor of Kunar ordered that interviews will no longer be conducted with the visual media. This ban follows the decree from last month that was to be gradually implemented in all provinces, with bans in Nangarhar, Kandahar, Takhar, Badghis, Helmand and Herat provinces already in practice.

On November 22nd, National Resistance Front (NRF) commander Hamid Saifi posted about the deeply concerning situation in Bagram Prison in relation to the Taliban's horrific treatment and relentless torture of NRF prisoners. Citing the freezing conditions of the cells where prisoners are denied basic necessities and medication, Saifi called on the United Nations to intervene by deploying a delegation to investigate these violations and injustices.

FURTHER CONFIRMED ATROCITIES

November 29th

The Guardian published a report on the Taliban's mass arresting of Afghan women for begging in the streets and their conditions in prisons where they are commonly raped and beaten.
