Re: Update Regarding 1998 Embassy Bombing Efforts

The Firm's 10th public webinar will take place on **March 12, 2024**. Those interested in attending should immediately contact Mr. Harris at LHARRIS@MUSOLINODESSEL.COM for further information.

A separate webinar will shortly be scheduled. Attendance at this webinar will be limited to Firm clients and certain other victims, and the Firm will require that confidentiality be respected. Those clients interested in attending should immediately contact Mr. Harris for further information.

In August 2023, 25 years after the bombing, the victims received enormous public support for compensation, including in particular for this Firm's plan to include Kenyan victims in the US Victim's Compensation Fund. Since October 2023, the Firm and Mr. Joe Szlavik have met in Washington with well-respected American government relations experts, and key Congressional figures, including a very productive meeting on Capitol Hill on January 18, 2024. Last month, consistent with Congressional deadlines and the January 18th meeting, the Firm delivered to 30 Congressional Offices, directly involved in the appropriate appropriations requests, a detailed request for inclusion of our proposed legislation in this budget round. Mr. Szlavik and I have another round of meetings scheduled for this upcoming week on our proposed legislation. The Firm is unaware of similar efforts by other Kenyan groups but would appreciate any information in that respect.

Appropriations bills for the following are now scheduled for vote on March 8, 2024: the Agriculture Department and Food and Drug Administration, the Commerce and **Justice Departments**, Science, Energy and Water Development, the Interior Department, **Military Construction** and the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Transportation Department and Housing and Urban Development.

Appropriations bills for the following are now scheduled for vote on March 22, 2024: **Defense**, Health and Human Services, Homeland Security, Financial Services, **State and Foreign Ops** and Legislative Branch, while negotiators work on a broader agreement to fully fund the government through the end of the fiscal year in September.

Support from the victims, as well as other Kenyans, the Kenyan government and the Kenyan diaspora in the US remains critical to our legislative efforts.
