INSTRUCTIONS. Each partner, officer, director, associate, employee, and agent of a registrant is required to file a short form registration statement unless he engages in no activities in furtherance of the interests of the registrant's foreign principal or unless the services he renders to the registrant are in a secretarial, clerical, or in a related or similar capacity. Compliance is accomplished by filing an electronic short form registration statement at <https://www.fara.gov>.

Privacy Act Statement. The filing of this document is required for the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, 22 U.S.C. § 611 *et seq.*, for the purposes of registration under the Act and public disclosure. Provision of the information requested is mandatory, and failure to provide the information is subject to the penalty and enforcement provisions established in Section 8 of the Act. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the FARA Unit in Washington, DC. Statements are also available online at the FARA Unit's webpage: <https://www.fara.gov>. One copy of every such document, other than informational materials, is automatically provided to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Act, and copies of any and all documents are routinely made available to other agencies, departments and Congress pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act. The Attorney General also transmits a semi-annual report to Congress on the administration of the Act which lists the names of all agents registered under the Act and the foreign principals they represent. Lobbying and Government Affairs Advisory: Providing counsel on approaches to U.S. congressional members, committees, and staff, as well as U.S. executive branch officials, including the Department of the Treasury and other relevant agencies, with the purpose of influencing their understanding and assessment of the foreign principal's compliance with international banking standards.

Public Relations and Perception Management: Advising on communications strategies to present the foreign principal as transparent, compliant, and aligned with U.S. interests, including guidance on public statements, media engagement, and informational outreach.

Promotion and Economic Development: Offering strategic advice to demonstrate the foreign principal's role in regional financial stability, legitimate cross-border banking operations, and support for U.S.-Lebanon economic cooperation.

Preparation and Dissemination of Informational Materials: Providing guidance on the drafting of informational materials, including briefing papers, policy memoranda, press statements, and op-eds for dissemination to policymakers, think tanks, advocacy organizations, and U.S. media outlets, with the objective of influencing attitudes toward the foreign principal.

Item 12: Do any of the above described services include political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act? If yes, describe separately and in detail such political activity. The response must include, but not be limited to, activities involving lobbying, promotion, perception management, public relations, economic development, and preparation or dissemination of informational materials.

The registrant will provide advisory services and lobbying on behalf of the foreign principal in order to influence the relations, interests, and policies of the United States Government. Such activities will include advising and lobbying members of Congress, congressional committees, and staff, as well as officials within the U.S. Department of the Treasury and other executive branch agencies, concerning the foreign principal's compliance with international banking standards, financial transparency, and alignment with U.S. counter-terrorism financing objectives. The registrant will also engage in public relations and perception management, including the preparation and dissemination of informational materials such as briefing memoranda, policy white papers, press statements, and op-eds; provide strategic guidance regarding media positioning and outreach; and advise on promotional and economic development initiatives designed to highlight the foreign principal's role in regional financial stability and constructive U.S.-Lebanon economic relations. These activities are intended to influence U.S. government decision-making, legislative and regulatory policy, and broader public opinion in the United States.
