**INSTRUCTIONS.** Each partner, officer, director, associate, employee, and agent of a registrant is required to file a short form registration statement unless he engages in no activities in furtherance of the interests of the registrant's foreign principal or unless the services he renders to the registrant are in a secretarial, clerical, or in a related or similar capacity. Compliance is accomplished by filing an electronic short form registration statement at <https://www.fara.gov>.

**Privacy Act Statement.** The filing of this document is required for the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, 22 U.S.C. § 611 *et seq.*, for the purposes of registration under the Act and public disclosure. Provision of the information requested is mandatory, and failure to provide the information is subject to the penalty and enforcement provisions established in Section 8 of the Act. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the FARA Unit in Washington, DC. Statements are also available online at the FARA Unit's webpage: <https://www.fara.gov>. One copy of every such document, other than informational materials, is automatically provided to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Act, and copies of any and all documents are routinely made available to other agencies, departments and Congress pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act. The Attorney General also transmits a semi-annual report to Congress on the administration of the Act which lists the names of all agents registered under the Act and the foreign principals they represent. 

## **Appendix Response to Item 11**

**Item 11: Describe in detail all services which you will render to the foreign principal listed in Item 10 either directly, or through the primary registrant listed in Item 8.**

The individual will provide comprehensive government affairs, strategic advisory, and public affairs services in the United States on behalf of the Foreign Principal. These services include direct engagement with Members of Congress, relevant congressional committees, and professional staff regarding matters affecting the Foreign Principal's regional security role, border integrity, post-conflict stabilization efforts, and long-term economic development objectives. The individual will prepare and deliver policy memoranda, briefing materials, issue papers, strategic talking points, and background analyses designed to articulate the Foreign Principal's positions in a manner consistent with U.S. law, policy frameworks, and congressional oversight practices. The individual will also conduct ongoing monitoring and analysis of legislative and executive-branch policy developments relevant to the Foreign Principal's interests and advise on appropriate engagement strategies.

In addition, the individual will engage, as appropriate, with officials at the U.S. Department of State, National Security Council, Department of Defense, Department of the Treasury, and other relevant agencies concerning diplomatic engagement, regional stabilization, defense cooperation, institutional modernization, and human rights compliance frameworks, including Leahy Law vetting requirements. Services further include advisory support related to U.S. policy affecting strategic and critical minerals, infrastructure security, supply-chain resilience, and broader economic development initiatives; coordination of meetings and briefings; strategic communications and stakeholder engagement counsel; reputation and perception management; and preparation and dissemination of informational materials to U.S. governmental and policy audiences. All services will be performed strictly in compliance with applicable U.S. laws and regulations, including the Foreign Agents Registration Act, the Lobbying Disclosure Act, export control statutes, and relevant ethical and oversight standards.

## **Appendix Response to Item 12**

**Item 12: Do any of the above described services include political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act? If yes, describe separately and in detail such political activity. The response must include, but not be limited to, activities involving lobbying, promotion, perception management, public relations, economic development, and preparation or dissemination of informational materials.**

Such political activities include direct engagement and communication with Members of Congress, congressional committees, and professional staff concerning legislation, oversight matters, and policy positions affecting the Foreign Principal's regional security posture, bilateral security cooperation, stabilization initiatives, human rights compliance considerations, sanctions frameworks, and economic development interests, including matters related to strategic and critical minerals and supply-chain resilience. These activities also include outreach to officials within the Department of State, National Security Council, Department of Defense, Department of the Treasury, and other relevant agencies to provide policy briefings, background materials, and analysis intended to inform deliberations related to diplomatic relations, defense cooperation, and regional security policy.

In addition, political activities include the preparation and dissemination of informational materials—such as policy memoranda, issue papers, briefing documents, talking points, and analytical summaries—designed to articulate the Foreign Principal's positions to U.S. governmental audiences. Where appropriate, such activities may also include coordination of meetings, briefings, and policy discussions; strategic communications counsel relating to public policy messaging; and stakeholder engagement within Washington, D.C. All such activities are conducted strictly in compliance with applicable U.S. law, including FARA, the Lobbying Disclosure Act, and relevant ethics and oversight requirements.
