## Short Form Registration Statement

### Pursuant to the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended

**INSTRUCTIONS.** Each partner, officer, director, associate, employee, and agent of a registrant is required to file a short form registration statement unless he engages in no activities in furtherance of the interests of the registrant's foreign principal or unless the services he renders to the registrant are in a secretarial, clerical, or in a related or similar capacity. Compliance is accomplished by filing an electronic short form registration statement at <https://www.fara.gov>.

**Privacy Act Statement.** The filing of this document is required for the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, 22 U.S.C. § 611 *et seq.*, for the purposes of registration under the Act and public disclosure. Provision of the information requested is mandatory, and failure to provide the information is subject to the penalty and enforcement provisions established in Section 8 of the Act. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the FARA Unit in Washington, DC. Statements are also available online at the FARA Unit's webpage: <https://www.fara.gov>. One copy of every such document, other than informational materials, is automatically provided to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Act, and copies of any and all documents are routinely made available to other agencies, departments and Congress pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act. The Attorney General also transmits a semi-annual report to Congress on the administration of the Act which lists the names of all agents registered under the Act and the foreign principals they represent. 

## **Appendix Response to Item 11**

**Item 11: Describe in detail all services which you will render to the foreign principal listed in Item 10 either directly, or through the primary registrant listed in Item 8.**

Will provide government affairs representation and strategic advisory services to the foreign principal within the United States. These services include advising on U.S. political, legislative, and national security developments and providing guidance on policy positioning, engagement strategy, and reputational considerations.

The individual will prepare and deliver briefing materials, memoranda, policy analyses, and other written communications to support the foreign principal's engagement with U.S. stakeholders. The individual will identify and assess relevant U.S. government officials, including Members of Congress, congressional staff, and executive branch personnel, and will facilitate, arrange, and may participate in meetings and communications with such officials.

The individual will also conduct outreach to U.S. government offices and other appropriate stakeholders to convey information regarding the foreign principal's policy perspectives and positions. In addition, the individual will develop messaging strategies and provide communications and perception management advisory services to support the foreign principal's engagement in the United States.

Services may further include coordination of follow-up engagement, preparation for high-level meetings, and ongoing strategic assessments responsive to developments in U.S. policy and international affairs. All services will be performed in compliance with the Foreign Agents Registration Act and applicable federal laws and regulations.

**Item 12: Do any of the above described services include political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act? If yes, describe separately and in detail such political activity. The response must include, but not be limited to, activities involving lobbying, promotion, perception management, public relations, economic development, and preparation or dissemination of informational materials.**

Will engage in political activities within the meaning of Section 1(o) of the Foreign Agents Registration Act by advising, informing, and, where appropriate, influencing U.S. government officials and policymakers with respect to U.S. foreign policy and matters affecting the political and public interests of the foreign principal.

Such activities include lobbying and government affairs engagement with Members of Congress, congressional staff, and executive branch officials through meetings, briefings, and written communications. The individual will prepare and disseminate informational materials, including policy memoranda, briefing papers, and talking points, and may communicate the foreign principal's policy perspectives on issues including democratic governance, economic development, regional stability, and U.S. bilateral relations with Nigeria and West Africa.

The individual will also engage in promotion, perception management, and public relations activities designed to inform U.S. policymakers and relevant stakeholders of the foreign principal's positions and leadership posture. This includes development of messaging strategies, narrative positioning, and reputational advisory services.

Methods employed include direct outreach, facilitation of meetings, written correspondence, preparation and distribution of informational materials, and ongoing strategic advisory services. All such activities will be conducted in compliance with applicable law and will be reported in supplemental statements as required under FARA.
