I am an Eritrean American who lived in Georgia since May of 1981. My name is Ghebre Bahdurai, and a successful entrepreneur who is married and a father of four boys. Three graduated from the Georgia Institute of Technology with a Master's in Computer Engineering. Two of them are double major Engineers. The youngest earned Bachelor of computer science from GSU, and the sky is the limit. Four of the boys earned an Associate Degree in Mathematics before finishing High-school.

All these achievements must come from their mom's side because I am not an engineer or great in Math. I am simply a proud dad to raise responsible citizens. I have been a member of Corpus Christ catholic church since 1986. I am a founder of the National Representative Council of Eritrea-GIE (Government-In-Exile), registered under a non-profit organization (501-C-4) in Georgia.

We are concerned by the developments in the Horn of Africa; in particular, the war in Sudan must stop before it spills over to the neighboring countries.

We are concerned about the State of Eritrea and its relationship with Russia. We need to stop the train before it goes too far. We are a temporary Government of Eritrea in exile, officially registered with the State Department of Justice and NSD. Now is the right time to move because we have linked the bridge necessary to get us home.

We want an appointment with your office and the State Department of the USA to explain our capabilities and share beneficial intel. Eritreans must decide the future. We will do the groundwork, including human intelligence and human resources necessary for an orderly transition. We have the proper connection at home.

We want you to champion our cause in the Department of Foreign Relations.
