Dear Hon. Obadiah Mua:

We are excited to have the opportunity to work with you. This letter of Agreement sets forth the parameters of the business relationship between Moran Global Strategies Inc. (referred to as "MGS"), and Ambazonia Governing Council (referred to as "AGovC"). MGS has had a record of success in representing emerging African states, African independence movements, and African governments-in-exile, such as the Biafra Republic Government-in-Exile and the National Representative Council of Eritrea-Government-in-Exile, and looks forward to achieving the same success on behalf of the AGovC.

Scope of Representation

This would be a bilateral contract which if signed and returned to us will establish a contract between MGS and AGovC. We will devote our best efforts to representing the AGovC and in doing so we will adhere strictly to both the legal and ethical obligations of our profession.

Under terms of this letter agreement, MGS agrees to provide AGovC with strategic advice and facilitate interaction with appropriate members of the Executive and Legislative Branches of the U.S. government, as well as third-party interests.

MGS will support AGovC's fundamental goal to encourage the United States government to support Ambazonia's independence and to recognize the AGovC as the entity which represents Ambazonia, and should be the primary point of contact for the United States government on issues concerning Ambazonia. MGS will promote the narrative to U.S. governmental and non-governmental stakeholders that Ambazonia, once an internationally recognized independent state, will be a close ally of the United States and an anchor of peace and stability in West Africa.

MGS will advise the US Government and private sector stakeholders of the challenges faced by the people of Ambazonia, and share the arguments as to why Ambazonia should be recognized as an independent state. MGS will also educate U.S. and non-U.S. stakeholders on issues of concern pertaining to the La République du Cameroun ("LRC"), including both the LRC's gross

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human rights abuses and crimes against humanity against the people of Ambazonia, as well as more broadly all the crime and abuses perpetrated during the decades-long dictatorship of Paul Biya. The US Administration should be encouraged to engage the AGovC directly and through advocacy by the US Congress and other stakeholders, including human rights organizations and think tanks.

Separate and concurrent initiatives with the US Administration, US Congress, and other stakeholders can be utilized to spread the message to policymakers and influencers throughout Washington, DC.

MGS will work with AGovC to secure meetings and communicate messaging with:

- House and Senate Leadership
- House Foreign Affairs and Senate Foreign Relations Committees
- House and Senate Appropriations Committees
- House and Senate Armed Services Committees
- Relevant House and Senate Congressional Caucus organizations and working groups
- Senior State Department, National Security Council, and White House Officials
- United States Commission on International Religious Freedom (USCIRF)
- Prominent religious, ethnic, and civil society organizations and personalities
- Media outlets, think-tanks, and human rights organizations
- Biafran diaspora in the United States

Anticipated activities include lobbying, promotion, perception management, public relations, and preparation or dissemination of informational materials.

MGS and AGovC agree to comply with all applicable laws, including those under the Lobbying Disclosure Act (LDA), as amended, the Foreign Agents Registration Act (FARA) as amended, and any regulations and/or rules promulgated thereunder. MGS acknowledges and understands that MGS will be solely responsible for its own compliance with all registration and reporting obligations imposed by FARA on MGS in connection with the services performed under this Agreement.

The following MGS lobbyists will register as foreign agents of the AGovC: James P. Moran, Chairman and former member of Congress, and Elias Gerasoulis, Vice President.

Relationship and Terms of Engagement

Subject to the terms of this paragraph, the AGovC will pay MGS a monthly fee of \$8,000 for services provided. This contract may be terminated with 30 days' notice provided on the first of the month prior to termination. The contract will commence on January 1, 2025, and conclude on December 31, 2025, with monthly fees billed in advance on the first of the month and due on

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or before the 15th day of each calendar month. This contract will automatically renew upon expiration on an annual basis on the same terms as indicated herein.

In addition, AGovC will reimburse MGS for reasonable and necessary out-of-pocket items that MGS receives prior authorization for, and that exceed, \$1,000.00. Administrative costs (phone, nominal travel, administrative support) are included in the retainer.

The engagement between the AGovC and Moran Global Strategies pre-excludes any contractual engagement with other Ambazonian groups or movements.

This agreement between the AGovC and Moran Global Strategies also pre-exclude services by MGS to the state of Cameroon or any other entity that projects the interests of Cameroon, which would constitute a conflict of interest.

As necessary, to hasten the recognition of Ambazonia within the global international system, MGS will outreach to international institutions like the European Union and the United Nations.

The AGovC will reserve the right to bring in third parties to work alongside MGS.

Independent Contractor

The Parties acknowledge awareness and stated preference that this is an agreement for services as an independent contractor. The Parties will exert all manner of good faith and take all reasonable efforts to ensure performance and prevent repudiation by other parties connected with its activities which could affect its performance under this Agreement. Furthermore, as an independent contractor, MGS shall not be held liable for any breach or failure to perform under subsequent contracts entered into between AGovC and any third Party.

It is further understood that MGS is retained by and has contracted with AGovC only for the purpose(s) and to the extent set forth above, and that MGS is an independent contractor, and shall be free to provide services to such persons or corporations as MGS deems advisable so long as same does not create a conflict of interest.

General provisions.

- a) No modification or waiver of this Agreement shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto.
- b) Severability. If one or more of the provisions in this Agreement are deemed void by law, then the remaining provisions will continue in full force and effect.
- c) This Agreement, and all transactions contemplated hereby, shall be governed by, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and the United States of America, without regard to its conflicts of laws provisions.

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- d) Any dispute arising under, related to or concerning this Agreement shall be litigated exclusively in federal or state court of competent jurisdiction that is situated in the Commonwealth of Virginia. In the event any legal action is necessary to enforce this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be able to recover any and all reasonable attorney fees and costs necessary to enforce this Agreement.
- e) During the term of this agreement and at all times thereafter, MGS shall not disclose confidential information related to AGovC, or to third parties, nor use confidential information for any purpose whatsoever except for the purpose of performing services on behalf of AGovC.
- f) MGS shall have sole responsibility for payment of all federal, State, and local taxes or contributions imposed or required under unemployment insurance, workmen's compensation, Social Security, and income tax laws and for filing all required tax forms with respect to any amounts paid by AGovC hereunder and any amounts paid by MGS to its employees. MGS shall indemnify and hold AGovC harmless against any claims or liability (including penalties) resulting from failure of MGS to pay such taxes or contributions, or failure of MGS to file any such tax forms.

In signing this letter and returning it to MGS, the AGovC will be indicating agreement to the fee schedule described herein and will be authorizing MGS to perform services according to the terms set forth herein.
