Who's Who in the Southern Transition Council (STC) Delegation

The Southern Transitional Council (STC) is a UAE-backed political organization that seeks representation and federation status or independence for southern Yemen. Formed in 2017 from a coalition of groups, the STC consists of a 24-member Leadership Council, which includes the governors of five southern governorates (provinces) and two government ministers, several departments, and a 303-member National Assembly. Amr Al-Bidh serves as Special Representative for Foreign Affairs to the President of the Southern Transitional Council (STC), where he maintains a prominent position in advising His Excellency STC President Al-Zubaidi. As the son of His Excellency Ali Salem Al-Bidh, the last President of South Yemen, Amr actively contributes to the Southern Movement, advancing the Southern Cause, where he helps facilitate international communication and outreach to global partners. Following the civil war in 1994, Amr was forced into exile due to his connections to the South. Despite this prolonged absence, he was able to return to Aden after 29 years.
