On behalf of Razom We Stand, a Ukraine-based and internationally active peace, clean energy, and climate organization, I write to urge [Rep. or Sen. Name] and you to join a growing bipartisan initiative advocating for decisive action against SLB's continued operations in Russia.

As you may be aware, 52 U.S. Congress colleagues from the House of Representatives have co-signed a [letter](#) to Secretaries Yellen and Blinken, calling for the revocation of SLB's exemptions to Russia sanctions and a complete halt to its activities in the country. SLB's ongoing presence in Russia directly undermines U.S. sanctions and enables the Kremlin to sustain its war effort against Ukraine. This situation not only compromises the spirit of U.S. policy but also weakens our collective stance against Russia's aggression and war crimes.

We recently sent a follow-up [letter](#) to Secretaries Yellen and Blinken, advocating for the immediate revocation of SLB's exemptions in Russia and a complete halt to its operations. Given recent media [reports](#) suggesting that the Biden administration is contemplating further sanctions on Russia's oil sector, your support now is crucial.

We seek your help moving the letter to Secretaries Yellen and Blinken forward and advancing the proposed actions outlined therein. Closing these loopholes will send a powerful message that U.S. companies cannot prioritize profit over principle in the face of war crimes and aggression.

To amplify the impact of your efforts, we would like to request an opportunity to brief your staff on the latest developments regarding SLB, Russian energy sector loopholes, and sanctions enforcement. By working together, we can ensure that the Biden administration can still implement the necessary steps to strengthen sanctions and align policy with our shared values of justice and accountability.

We would be honored to brief your team at your earliest convenience. Thank you for your unwavering support for Ukraine and for your commitment to protecting global peace and justice.
