

The aid is currently flowing through only junta-controlled territory.

Represent the Office of the President of the National Unity Government of Myanmar in the United States of America by initiating discussions with and engaging with the Administration of U.S. President Trump at senior levels on ways to support the success of the Burmese people's fight to end the military junta's brutality, atrocities, and violence; to implement sustainable peace; and to establish the prosperous federal union of Burma and build a mutually beneficial strategic relationship between Myanmar/Burma and the United States.

The envoy will meet with the Congressional Burma Caucus, members of the Senate, and members of the Administration of U.S. President Trump at senior levels to discuss changing U.S. domestic views and foreign policy regarding Burma and its neighboring countries and to encourage aid flowing into the country to be disbursed to all the people in need effected by the earthquake.

Currently, there are 55 million people living in Burma. Thirteen (13) million people live in areas effected by the Sagaing Earthquake and approximately 5 million people were directly impacted by the earthquake and need assistance. However, only half of those people are receiving the aid because the military-junta is only distributing aid to the parts of the country it controls. The rest of the Burmese people effected by the earthquake are living without food, clean water, fuel, and other basic necessities.

Parallel international humanitarian assistance is required to reach all of the people affected by the earthquake. The goal of the envoy's meetings is to promote the equal distribution of humanitarian aid in Burma by fostering cross border assistance from India and Thailand to directly reach the effected populations in non-junta-controlled areas. This is in alignment with Secretary Rubio's April 13, 2025 statement on Burma's Thingyan Festival and New Year 2025, which stated that the U.S. will "continue to join with the international community in providing lifesaving humanitarian aid and supporting recovery efforts."

Appendix

Terms of Reference – Envoy to the United States of America

Acting President of the National Unity Government of Myanmar Duwa Lashi La has appointed Mr. John F. Todoroki as Envoy to the United States of America.

John will initiate the discussions with US President Trump and his administration on ways to support the success of the Burmese people's fight to end the military junta's brutality, atrocities, and violence; to implement sustainable peace; and to establish the prosperous federal union of Burma and build a mutually beneficial strategic relationship between Myanmar/Burma and the United States.

The Envoy will assist and advise the Acting President and the National Unity Government (NUG) by:

- Raising awareness of the challenges faced by the people of Myanmar/Burma;
- Identifying ways to advance the National Unity Government's relationships with the United States, particularly with high-level members of President Trump's administration and the US Congress;
- Exploring how new formal and informal engagements could improve relationships between the NUG and the US Administration to enable effective support from the US;
- Working with the Trump Administration and US lawmakers on a range of options for receiving financial and material support, including for civilian protection, lifesaving humanitarian assistance, and mutually beneficial development initiatives;
- Maintaining internal co-ordination and cooperation with relevant NUG entities, including the Office of the President and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, ensuring that any and all of the Envoy's engagements are coherent with the Acting President's direction and the National Unity Government's policies; and
- Undertaking other related tasks assigned by the Acting President from time to time.

The Envoy will report to the Acting President and provide regular information, updates and advice. To enable strategic planning and policy coherence, the Envoy will submit a work plan in the first thirty days of the appointment, and regular status reports.

The Envoy will work and consult closely with Kyaw Zaw, Advisor to the Acting President and Spokesperson, to ensure smooth operations and oversight. This will include ongoing coordination of initiatives, reporting on meetings with US government personnel, and support as needed preparing for planned meetings.

The initial appointment shall be for six months starting immediately and is extendable. The Acting President may terminate the appointment in writing without cause.

All communications of the Envoy will be attributed to the Envoy and not the National Unity Government as a whole. The Envoy shall not have any mandate to speak to the media or make statements on behalf of the National Unity Government. This appointment shall not be made public.

Remuneration:

The Envoy will be a non-statutory appointment and unpaid. The Envoy may appoint support staff at his own expense as required.
