

Appendix Response to Item 5

Item 5: Each item checked above must be explained below in full detail together with, where appropriate, specific reference to and identity of the item in the registration statement to which it pertains.

Previously, Articles of Incorporation for the registrant was attached under this section. While there was no contract or agreement between the foreign principal and the registrant, internal decisions within the foreign principal were simply announced and subsequently executed to incorporate a nonprofit organization in the U.S. to monitor and summarize legislative developments to facilitate bilateral dialogue for informational and education purposes.

Establishment Process by Timeline:

- July 2023: Speaker of the National Assembly Kim Jin-pyo announced the establishment of the Korea-U.S. Parliamentary Exchange Center at a press conference.
- December 2023: Budget secured in the 2024 National Assembly budget for the establishment and operation of the Korea-U.S. Parliamentary Exchange Center.
- February 2024: Lease agreement signed for office space to be used as the center's office.
- March 2024: Corporate establishment procedures completed with the Washington D.C. state government.
- April 2024: Temporary office opened.
- June 2024: Two employees hired (one researcher, one administrator).
- October 2024: Chairman appointed and the board of directors expanded (to a total of five members).
- January 2025: Center's website (www.kipec.org) established.
- June 2025: Center director appointed.

The 2025 budget for the Korea-U.S. Parliamentary Exchange Center is approximately 1 billion Korean Won (about \$70,000 USD), with office rent being the largest portion. The National Assembly deposits the necessary budget into the center's corporate account on a quarterly basis.
