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# A Ceasefire Will Not Lead to Peace: Why Israel Must Ensure Hezbollah Cannot Threaten the North Again

For years, Hezbollah<sup>[6]</sup> built military positions near the border, accumulated massive stockpiles of rockets and missiles, and openly threatened Israeli civilians. Much of this occurred despite international resolutions that were supposed to prevent exactly that outcome.

The result was predictable. When conflict erupted, northern Israel became a target.

A ceasefire that merely freezes the situation without changing it risks recreating the same conditions that led to the crisis in the first place.

## The Lessons of the Last Two Decades

Israel has seen this movie before. After the 2006 Lebanon War, many believed that international agreements and diplomatic guarantees would keep Hezbollah away from the border and prevent future escalation.

Instead, Hezbollah spent years rebuilding<sup>[3]</sup>. Its arsenal grew dramatically. Its military infrastructure expanded. Its capabilities became more sophisticated.

What was presented as a solution ultimately became a period of preparation for the next confrontation.

The lesson is not that diplomacy is ineffective. The lesson is that diplomacy without enforcement is ineffective.

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Israel's security cannot depend on assumptions that Hezbollah will voluntarily abandon capabilities it spent decades acquiring.

## October 7 Changed Israeli Thinking

Before [October 7 \(https://paxpoint.org/stories-of-resilience/\)](https://paxpoint.org/stories-of-resilience/), many Israelis believed threats could be managed<sup>[1]</sup> through deterrence and periodic responses. One of the most significant consequences of October 7 is that Israelis are far less willing to tolerate heavily armed terrorist organizations positioned directly on their borders.

The idea that Hezbollah could maintain extensive military infrastructure in southern Lebanon while Israel simply hoped deterrence would work has lost much of its credibility.

The security doctrine that emerges from October 7 is clear: threats must be addressed before they mature into catastrophes.

That lesson applies to the northern front no less than it applies to Gaza.

## A Rare Opportunity for a Different Reality

The current diplomatic discussions matter because they create a possibility that did not exist before.

For the first time in years, there is an opportunity to move beyond crisis management and address the source of the threat itself.

The focus should not be on preserving a ceasefire at any cost.

The focus<sup>[1]</sup> should be on creating conditions under which Hezbollah can no longer threaten Israeli communities with mass rocket fire, cross-border attacks, or large-scale evacuations.

If direct talks produce mechanisms that prevent Hezbollah from rebuilding its military infrastructure near the border, they will have achieved something meaningful.

If they merely produce a temporary reduction in violence while Hezbollah regroups, the underlying problem remains unresolved.

# What Israelis Need

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The people of northern Israel do not need another round of promises. They need certainty. Parents need confidence that schools will remain open. Businesses need confidence that they can invest and grow.

Families need confidence that they will not once again be forced to abandon their homes because a terrorist organization decides to launch another war.

Those goals cannot be achieved solely through ceasefire agreements.

They require a security environment in which Hezbollah lacks the ability to impose its will on northern Israel.

For years, Hezbollah's missile arsenal gave it the power to disrupt daily life for hundreds of thousands of Israelis. Preventing a return to that reality should be a central objective of Israeli policy.

## Conclusion

The ceasefire is welcome and a potential reduction in violence is important. The diplomatic discussions between Israel and Lebanon create opportunities that should be pursued.

But we should not mistake a pause in fighting for a resolution of the conflict.

The ultimate question is whether the threat that emptied northern communities, disrupted countless lives, and endangered Israeli civilians will be allowed to reemerge. If history teaches anything, it is that temporary quiet is not enough when a terrorist army remains intact just beyond the border.

For Israel, the goal cannot simply be another ceasefire. The goal must be a new reality in which the residents of the north can live, work, raise families, and build their future without Hezbollah's rockets hanging over their heads. That is the standard by which this moment should be judged, and anything less risks repeating the mistakes of the past.

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# The UN Blacklisted Israel for Sexual Violence. Then Its Own Official Admitted She Never Verified the Evidence.

The United Nations has spent years presenting itself as the world's referee on human rights, war crimes, and international law. According to multiple reports<sup>[1]</sup>, Patten acknowledged that she did not personally examine the evidence behind the allegations used to place Israel on the blacklist. When asked whether she had seen the evidence herself, she reportedly answered: "No, because it's not my job."

She also stated that she would not visit detention facilities to conduct verification, even if Israel offered access. Instead, she described herself as a recipient of information gathered by others.

That answer would be shocking in any serious legal or investigative setting.

Imagine a prosecutor announcing criminal allegations and then explaining that personally reviewing the evidence was not part of the job. Imagine a judge issuing a ruling while openly acknowledging no direct examination of the underlying facts. The public would immediately question the legitimacy of the process.

Yet this is the standard now being defended in one of the most politically explosive accusations made against Israel during the current conflict.

## **Israel Was Expected to Be Judged Without Direct Verification**

Israel maintains military courts, civilian courts, internal investigations, oversight bodies, legal review systems, and a Supreme Court that regularly hears petitions regarding military conduct<sup>[4]</sup>.

According to Israeli officials, extensive information was provided to UN representatives. Israel says it submitted detailed responses, legal procedures, oversight mechanisms, and opportunities for engagement with senior officials.

Despite that, the UN official responsible for advancing the accusations acknowledged she would not personally conduct verification visits.

That creates a troubling contradiction.

The UN expects Israel to answer accusations carrying enormous reputational consequences. Yet the official behind those accusations publicly stated that independently confirming the evidence was not her role.

For critics, that is not accountability. It is bureaucracy replacing investigation.

## **A Stark Contrast With October 7**

The controversy becomes even more striking when compared with the UN's own response to Hamas's October 7 atrocities<sup>[3]</sup>.

In early 2024, Patten traveled to Israel, met witnesses, reviewed thousands of images, examined video footage, visited attack sites, and conducted an extensive fact-finding effort regarding Hamas's crimes. After that investigation, she concluded there were reasonable grounds to believe rape and gang rape occurred during the attacks and that hostages experienced sexual violence.

That process involved direct engagement with evidence and firsthand examination.

Now, in the case of allegations against Israel, the same official says verification was not her responsibility.

The inconsistency is difficult to ignore, and the recent report separately says the United Nations was unable to verify six public accounts of sexual violence<sup>[3]</sup> from hostages released from Hamas captivity.

If direct examination mattered when assessing Hamas, why does it not matter when accusing Israel?

## **The Problem Is Bigger Than One Report**

This controversy touches a broader concern that has followed the UN for years.

Many governments, legal experts, and watchdog organizations have argued that Israel is often subjected to standards<sup>[5]</sup> that are not applied equally elsewhere. The issue is not whether allegations against Israel should be examined. They should be. The issue is whether international institutions are applying the standards they claim to uphold.

When a senior UN official openly states that verifying the facts was not her job, many people will reasonably ask what exactly the blacklist was based on and whether the process meets the level of scrutiny that such accusations demand.

The UN's decision to place Israel on a sexual violence blacklist was already deeply problematic and controversial. The subsequent admission from the official behind the report has made the situation far more serious.

The story is not just about one accusation. It reveals how modern information networks can manufacture credibility through repetition, emotional imagery, and circular sourcing. That would normally be where a responsible investigation begins.

Instead, for many activists online, it became the conclusion.

## The Escalation From Allegation to “Fact”

According to an analysis<sup>[1]</sup>, the story changed significantly as it spread. An Instagram graphic circulated showing plastic restraints labeled as belonging to an adult, a child, and a baby. The graphic presented the allegation as established fact even though no

publicly available forensic evidence had been produced.

A claim begins as a possibility.

A graphic presents it as reality.

Influencers share the graphic.

Activists cite the influencers.

Journalists cite the activists.

The public sees dozens of sources repeating the same claim and assumes independent verification has occurred.

In reality, everyone may be tracing back to the same original unverified allegation.

## **The Closed Loop Problem**

One of the most effective ways misinformation<sup>[4]</sup> spreads is through what researchers often describe as circular sourcing.

Person A cites Organization B.

Organization B cites Activist C.

Activist C cites Person A.

To an outside observer, it appears that multiple independent sources have confirmed the story.

In reality, the same unsupported claim is simply being repeated within a closed network.

The investigation argues that this is exactly what happened with the “zip-tied babies” allegation. The article found that activists, advocacy organizations, and social media accounts repeatedly cited one another while no independent forensic evidence emerged to support the central claim.

The appearance of consensus replaced actual verification.

## **Why Emotional Stories Travel Faster Than Facts**

The accusation involved babies, mass graves, and graphic imagery. Those elements make a story highly effective on social media because they trigger immediate emotional reactions.

People rarely share posts<sup>[2]</sup> because they have verified every detail.

They share them because they are shocked, angry, or horrified.

Once an emotionally charged narrative takes hold, corrections rarely travel as far as the original claim. Research on misinformation has repeatedly shown that sensational accusations often reach larger audiences than subsequent fact-checks.

By the time questions arise, millions of people may already believe the story.

## **The Historical Context: From Medieval Blood Libels to Modern Variations**

The accusation carries echoes of older antisemitic themes that portrayed Jews as uniquely cruel toward children. Medieval blood libels<sup>[5]</sup> falsely accused Jews of murdering Christian children. These fabrications fueled centuries of persecution across Europe and the Middle East.

Modern versions rarely use the same language, but they often rely on the same formula:

- Jews are accused of uniquely monstrous acts.
- Evidence is weak, disputed, or absent.
- The accusation spreads globally before verification occurs.
- Corrections receive far less attention than the original claim.

Organizations that track antisemitism have noted that modern conspiracy theories involving organ harvesting, child murder, and similar allegations frequently draw on the same themes found in historical blood libels.

The lesson is not that every allegation should be dismissed. Legitimate investigations into wartime conduct are necessary and should be based on evidence.

The lesson is that evidence must come before conclusions.

When activists, influencers, organizations, and media figures repeat the same claim without independent verification, they create the illusion of proof where none may exist.

In a digital world where information moves faster than facts can be checked, skepticism is not cynicism. It is responsibility.

The “zip-tied babies” allegation serves as a powerful example of how lies and deliberate misinformation can be manufactured and amplified in the twenty-first century. During Operation Epic Fury, Iran did not limit its actions to Israel. It launched missiles and drones toward multiple targets<sup>[6]</sup> across the region, including infrastructure and population centers in the Gulf.

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# Information Manipulation at the United Nations During the Gaza War

Since the October 7, 2023 Hamas massacre, the war in Gaza has become one of the most heavily reported conflicts in modern history. International organizations, governments, media outlets, and courts have relied heavily on information released by United Nations agencies when assessing the humanitarian situation and evaluating Israel's military campaign against Hamas. A new report shows that many of those UN reports failed to meet basic standards of neutrality, accuracy, and transparency.

The report, titled *Information Manipulation by UN Actors on the War in Gaza (2023-2025)*, presents a detailed critique of how several UN agencies gathered, presented, and distributed information during the conflict. Certain UN officials and agencies repeated unverified claims, omitted key context regarding Hamas's conduct, and published statistics that created a distorted picture of events on the ground. The findings have added to a growing debate about whether parts of the UN system have maintained impartiality when addressing Israel and the Gaza war.

Israeli officials argue that this process gave political legitimacy to statistics that had not undergone independent review.

The report<sup>[5]</sup> places particular focus on casualty figures released throughout the war. It argues that UN agencies regularly cited cumulative death totals from Gaza's Health Ministry without distinguishing between civilians and combatants.

This reporting method differs from how the UN typically handles casualty figures in other conflicts. Israeli officials contend that the lack of clear disclaimers regarding the source of the data created confusion among journalists, policymakers, and the public. They also point to later revisions of some casualty figures as evidence that earlier numbers may have been inaccurate or incomplete.

The report argues that early casualty statistics became central to international narratives portraying Israel's military campaign as uniquely destructive, even as some figures were later adjusted.

## The Debate Over Humanitarian Aid

Another major section examines claims regarding humanitarian aid deliveries into Gaza. During several stages of the war, UN agencies warned that aid deliveries had fallen dramatically and that severe shortages were developing.

The Israeli report argues that some of these conclusions relied on incomplete datasets. As one example, it cites May 2024, when UN reporting suggested aid deliveries had fallen sharply. Israeli officials say later revisions and Israeli government tracking data showed substantially higher numbers of aid trucks entering Gaza than initially reported. According to the report, this discrepancy contributed to widespread claims that Israel was intentionally restricting humanitarian supplies at levels not supported by the full data.

Accurate reporting<sup>[6]</sup> on aid flows is especially important because allegations of starvation and humanitarian deprivation have played a major role in international legal and diplomatic actions against Israel.

## Hamas's Role and Missing Context

The report also argues that many UN publications failed to provide sufficient context regarding Hamas's military tactics.

There are many examples of Hamas's documented<sup>[7]</sup> use of civilian areas for military purposes, including weapons storage, tunnel networks, command centers, and rocket launch sites. The report shows that these practices were rarely emphasized in humanitarian reporting, even though they directly affect civilian risk and military decision-making.

The report also highlights allegations that Hamas diverted aid supplies, prevented civilian evacuations, and embedded military infrastructure within hospitals, schools, and residential neighborhoods. According to the report, these issues often received little attention compared with allegations directed at Israel.

Omitting these factors can leave audiences with an incomplete understanding of why civilian suffering occurs during urban warfare against a terrorist organization operating within densely populated areas.

## **Broader Concerns About UN Neutrality**

The findings fit into a larger critique of certain UN institutions<sup>[8]</sup>. Israeli officials have argued for years that some UN bodies apply different standards to Israel than to other nations.

Israel's Foreign Ministry has published additional material accusing various UN agencies and officials of spreading misleading information and applying double standards in their treatment of Israel. These publications argue that anti-Israel bias has expanded beyond political bodies and into agencies expected to operate according to principles of neutrality and professionalism.

The report stresses that its criticism is not directed at all UN organizations or humanitarian workers. It acknowledges that many UN personnel continue to perform important humanitarian work. Its focus is on agencies and officials that it argues departed from accepted standards of objectivity and impartiality.

## **Why the Issue Matters**

The influence of UN reporting extends far beyond daily news coverage. UN publications are routinely cited in international court filings, diplomatic debates, academic studies, government policy discussions, and media reporting around the world.

Because of that influence, the report argues that inaccuracies can have lasting consequences. Information released under the UN banner often gains immediate credibility and can shape public understanding long after corrections or revisions are made. Israeli officials contend that flawed reporting contributed to legal and political campaigns targeting Israel while minimizing scrutiny of Hamas's conduct during the war.

The report also warns that misinformation surrounding the conflict has fueled hostility toward Jewish communities in many countries by reinforcing claims that Israel intentionally targets civilians.

# Conclusion

The Israeli government's report presents a detailed challenge to the credibility of several UN agencies involved in reporting on the Gaza war. Its central claim is that unverified information, selective reporting, and the omission of Hamas's role produced a one-sided narrative that shaped global opinion against Israel. Whether critics fully accept every conclusion or not, the report raises serious questions about how international organizations collect information during wartime and how that information influences public debate.

The larger issue extends beyond Israel and Gaza. International institutions hold significant authority because they are expected to operate according to standards of neutrality, evidence, and transparency. When questions arise about whether those standards are being applied consistently, confidence in those institutions can weaken. ## Targeting Israel and the United States

The report highlights that Israel and the United States are primary targets of these campaigns. In Israel's case, disinformation often focuses on military operations, civilian casualties, and internal divisions. By distorting facts, these efforts aim to erode international support and create pressure on Israeli decision-making.

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# Islamist Speakers in Texas Call for Global Islamic Rule, including the U.S.

Public discussions about political and radical Islam often focus on terrorism, extremism, or conflicts in the Middle East. Less attention is given to statements made openly by clerics and activists who advocate replacing secular systems with Islamic governance on a global scale. A new video draws attention to speeches delivered at an Islamic conference where several participants spoke about Islam eventually governing the world, including the United States.

The video has renewed debate about the difference between mainstream Muslim religious practice and political Islamist movements that seek to establish societies governed by Islamic law. These statements reveal ideological goals that are often minimized in Western discussions.

## Political Islam Versus Personal Faith

One of the central issues raised by the conference is the distinction<sup>[2]</sup> between Islam as a religion and Islamism as a political ideology.

Most Muslims around the world practice their faith peacefully and participate in a wide range of political systems. Large Muslim populations live successfully within democratic societies, including the United States. Research<sup>[5]</sup> from the Pew Research Center has shown that Muslim views vary significantly across countries and cultures, particularly regarding governance and religious law.

Political Islamist movements take a different approach. Their goal is not merely religious observance but the establishment of governments based on Islamic legal and political principles. ## Why America Was Mentioned

One of the most widely discussed statements from the conference involved predictions that America could eventually become a Muslim country.

Critics argue that the significance of the statement lies less in demographic reality and more in the underlying political aspiration. They contend that the speaker was expressing a vision of societal transformation rather than making a statistical forecast.

The comments have fueled concerns among observers who argue that some Islamist activists view Western freedoms as opportunities to advance political objectives that would ultimately restrict those same freedoms if fully implemented.

## A Continuing Debate in the West

The MEMRI report arrives during a period of increasing debate<sup>[4]</sup> across Europe and North America about political Islam, immigration, religious freedom, and national identity.

According to UN Watch, Douhan received<sup>[2]</sup> approximately \$1.3 million in funding from China, Russia, and Qatar while serving in her UN role. The report argues that her investigations focused heavily on criticizing Western sanctions while avoiding criticism of the governments providing funding.

The report also highlights allegations involving Ben Saul, who reportedly received funding connected to China while remaining largely silent on the treatment of Uyghur Muslims in Xinjiang. UN Watch argues that this silence stands in contrast to his criticism of Western counterterrorism (<https://justorium.org/us-israel/joint-counterterrorism-frameworks/>) policies.

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Another example involves George Katrougalos, whom the report says received funding from China while publicly praising Chinese leadership and policy initiatives.

Critics argue that such relationships create an appearance of bias that damages the credibility of the UN system.

## The Israel Question

For many observers, the debate over UN impartiality is inseparable<sup>[4]</sup> from the treatment of Israel. Critics have argued for years that UN bodies devote a disproportionate amount of attention to Israel compared with countries that commit far more severe human rights violations.

Previous research<sup>[6]</sup> found that the Human Rights Council passed more condemnatory resolutions against Israel than against many of the world's most repressive governments combined. Countries such as Iran, China, Venezuela, and Syria have often received less sustained attention despite documented records of political repression and human rights abuses.

Some Special Rapporteurs have amplified narratives hostile to Israel while showing less urgency when addressing abuses committed by groups such as Hamass (<https://justorium.org/documentation/hamass-legal-record-a-history-of-lawlessness-and-terror/>) or governments with poor human rights records. According to UN Watch, this pattern has contributed to declining confidence in the Council's objectivity.

## Why the Findings Matter

The significance of these allegations extends beyond internal UN politics. Reports produced by Special Rapporteurs often influence diplomatic discussions, court proceedings, media coverage, and policy decisions around the world.

Weak evidentiary standards present another major concern. The report claims that some mandate holders rely on anonymous testimony and unverified submissions from advocacy organizations. Critics say this can lead to politically charged conclusions that are difficult to independently verify.

Supporters of reform believe that human rights investigations must meet high standards of evidence and impartiality. They argue that if those standards are not maintained, public trust in international institutions suffers.

# Proposed Reforms

UN Watch is calling for a series of structural changes aimed at increasing transparency and accountability. Among its recommendations are:

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• A ban on earmarked government funding for Special Rapporteurs.

• Independent external review and disciplinary procedures.

- Public disclosure of funding sources and potential conflicts of interest.
- Stronger evidentiary standards for reports and investigations.
- External vetting of candidates before appointment.
- Mechanisms for removing mandate holders who violate ethical standards.

Supporters of these reforms argue that they would strengthen confidence in the UN human rights system and help restore its credibility.

## Conclusion

UN Watch's report presents a forceful critique of the United Nations Human Rights Council and its Special Rapporteur system. The organization argues that political bias, financial conflicts, and weak accountability mechanisms have weakened what was intended to be one of the UN's most respected human rights institutions. Whether every allegation ultimately withstands scrutiny, the report raises serious questions about transparency, independence, and the consistent application of human rights standards.

For Americans and others who look to international organizations for impartial assessments, the debate goes beyond any single country or controversy. The larger issue is whether institutions tasked with defending human rights can maintain public trust if they are perceived as applying different standards to democracies and authoritarian regimes. The answer to that question will shape the credibility of the UN human rights system for years to come.

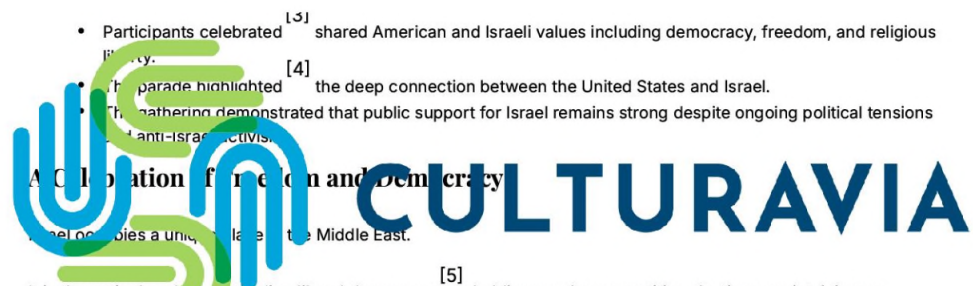

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## The Farhud at 85: Why the Forgotten Massacre of Iraqi Jewry Still Matters Today

Eighty-five years ago, on the Jewish holiday of Shavuot, one of the most devastating attacks on a Jewish community in the modern Middle East unfolded in the streets of Baghdad. Known as the Farhud, the two-day pogrom of June 1-2, 1941, left hundreds of Jews dead, injured many more, and shattered the sense of security of one of the world's oldest Jewish communities. The deeper lesson is that minority communities without political power or means of self-defense often depend on the decisions of others for their survival. Throughout Jewish history, communities in Europe, North Africa, and the Middle East repeatedly found themselves exposed<sup>[4]</sup> when governments collapsed, rulers changed, or antisemitic movements gained strength.

The Jews of Baghdad were not attacked because they lacked roots in the land. They had roots stretching back more than 2,500 years, long before their Muslim and Arab neighbors. They were attacked because they were Jews and because they lacked the ability to protect themselves when law and order disappeared.

The establishment of the State of Israel in 1948 marked a historic change in Jewish history. For the first time in nearly two thousand years, the Jewish people regained sovereignty in their ancestral homeland.
