Curriculum Vitae – Ambassador Lazaro Nyalandu

PROFILE

Ambassador Lazaro Nyalandu is the Advisor to the President of the United Republic of Tanzania on Diplomatic Affairs, having been appointed to this role in November 2025.

He is a former Minister for Natural Resources and Tourism. Prior to his appointment as Cabinet Minister, he served as Deputy Minister for Natural Resources and Tourism and Deputy Minister for Industry and Trade. Ambassador Nyalandu was elected as Member of Parliament for Singida North Constituency on the CCM ticket in 2000 and was re-elected in 2005, 2010, and 2015. He served as an elected Member of Parliament from 2000 to 2017, leaving Parliament as a ranking member of the Foreign Relations Committee and the Public Accounts Committee. During his tenure, he represented the Parliament of Tanzania in numerous national and international engagements.

As Minister for Natural Resources and Tourism, Ambassador Nyalandu pioneered cross-boundary conservation collaboration within East Africa through EAC ministerial consultations, including initiatives on the Mara–Serengeti ecosystem shared by Tanzania and Kenya, protection of miombo woodlands across Southern and Eastern Africa, national elephant population surveys, and the establishment of the Tanzania Wildlife Authority (TAWA). He also led the formulation and signing of the Selous–Niassa Corridor Agreement between Tanzania and Mozambique in 2015, with participation from Germany, the United States, UNDP, the World Bank, and ICCF (USA).

He remains a strong advocate for stakeholder and community participation in global collaboration, particularly in conservation, transboundary ecosystem management, and sustainable development policies that balance environmental protection with community livelihoods.
