Text amended in accordance with Legislative Act 1 of 2009 and Law 1475 of 2011

TITLE I
GENERAL PROVISIONS
CHAPTER I
CONSTITUTION AND PURPOSES

ARTICLE 1.

The MIRA Political Party is constituted as a Political Party, created in accordance with the provisions of the Political Constitution and the current national legislation, with the purpose of participating in the democratic life of the country by disseminating and promoting the ideas set forth in its declaration of principles and programmatic platform, the defense of individual rights and freedoms, the prevalence of the general interest as a fundamental basis of the democratic ideal, and the strengthening of the constitutional and legal order.

As a development of the principles that inspire it, the Party shall seek to influence the formation of the political will of citizens and shall participate, when it deems appropriate or when such participation is mandatory, in electoral processes.

As a Political Party, MIRA is a permanent institution that reflects political pluralism, promotes and channels citizen participation, and contributes to the formation and expression of the popular will, with the aim of accessing power, holding elected public office, and influencing the political and democratic decisions of the Nation.

In addition to its political achievements and their constant dissemination, and as support for them, MIRA shall carry out broad and continuous social work aimed at strengthening the constant pursuit of peace, solidarity, deliberation, integrity, democracy, freedom, justice, equality, knowledge, and work for all Colombians.

ARTICLE 2.

The MIRA Political Party adopts as its political ideology "MIRAISM FOR ABSOLUTE RENEWAL"[®].

MIRaism is human and political conduct based on values and their application, which is manifested in individual and collective actions: individual actions, through each person who seeks Absolute Renewal[®], and collective actions, as the result of the sum of those individual achievements that lead to respectful coexistence within the broader environment of society, community, and culture.

The Party shall participate in the political and electoral context under the ideology of MIRaism[®], transcending its application to the public sphere in order to influence the transformation of political, economic, social, and environmental realities through conduct grounded in virtuous and exemplary behavior that seeks to achieve the highest level of respect for human dignity, the improvement of quality of life, and the consolidation of a harmonious society.

The core principles that sustain the conduct of MIRaism for Absolute Renewal are:

Truthfulness, expressed in the capacity for self-governance;

Coherence, understood as the real materialization of discourse;

Practicality, which guides political action toward results that serve or benefit individuals.

Likewise, as an ideology grounded in values, its fundamental values are understood to be:

Solidarity, aimed at building lasting relationships based on mutual support;

Justice, grounded in equity, balance, and impartiality;

Loyalty, materialized through commitment to work and service to people;

Honesty, understood as the integration of the fundamental values.

Partido Político MIRA conducts various activities in the U.S. to strengthen representation of Colombians abroad and to encourage democratic participation, all in compliance with Colombian law. The key activities include:

1. Surveys and Research

- o Conducting surveys targeting the Colombian community in the U.S. to assess their needs, challenges, and potential improvements in services provided by the Colombian government.

- o These surveys are organized and executed by local volunteers and political leaders in different cities using electronic platforms.

2. Political Campaigns

- o Every four years, in accordance with Colombian law, the party promotes electoral participation among Colombians living abroad for the election of senators and representatives in Colombia's Congress including the election of the representative representing Colombians abroad.

- o Activities include organizing informational events, community discussions, and meetings to encourage voter turnout.

3. Meetings with Colombian Candidates

- o Party candidates visit the U.S. during their campaigns to interact with the Colombian community, inform them about their initiatives, and receive voter feedback.

- o These meetings aim to enhance transparency and accountability regarding the actions of elected representatives in Colombia.

4. Advocacy and Public Awareness

- o Beyond election-related activities, volunteers also focus on issues affecting the Colombian diaspora, such as religious freedom, access to social benefits, community integration, and the promotion of legal and responsible migration.

- o As part of this work, there is consideration of engaging with U.S. government officials, members of Congress, and other representatives to discuss matters of mutual interest.
