Privacy Act Statement. The filing of this document is required for the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, 22 U.S.C. § 611 *et seq.*, for the purposes of registration under the Act and public disclosure. Provision of the information requested is mandatory, and failure to provide the information is subject to the penalty and enforcement provisions established in Section 8 of the Act. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the FARA Unit in Washington, DC. One copy of every such document, other than informational materials, is automatically provided to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Act, and copies of any and all documents are routinely made available to other agencies, departments and Congress pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act. The Attorney General also transmits a semi-annual report to Congress on the administration of the Act which lists the names of all agents registered under the Act and the foreign principals they represent. 

Appendix Response to Item 11

Item 11: Describe in detail all services which you will render to the foreign principal listed in Item 10 either directly, or through the primary registrant listed in Item 8.

1. Surveys and Research

- o Conducting surveys targeting the Colombian community in the U.S. to assess their needs, challenges, and potential improvements in services provided by the Colombian government.
- o These surveys are organized and executed by local volunteers and political leaders in different cities using electronic platforms.

2. Political Campaigns

- o Every four years, in accordance with Colombian law, the party promotes electoral participation among Colombians living abroad for the election of senators and representatives in Colombia's Congress including the election of the representative representing Colombians abroad.
- o Activities include organizing informational events, community discussions, and meetings to encourage voter turnout.

3. Meetings with Colombian Candidates

- o Party candidates visit the U.S. during their campaigns to interact with the Colombian community, inform them about their initiatives, and receive voter feedback.
- o These meetings aim to enhance transparency and accountability regarding the actions of elected representatives in Colombia.

4. Advocacy and Public Awareness

- o Beyond election-related activities, volunteers also focus on issues affecting the Colombian diaspora, such as religious freedom, access to social benefits, community integration, and the promotion of legal and responsible migration.
- o As part of this work, there is consideration of engaging with U.S. government officials, members of Congress, and other representatives to discuss matters of mutual interest.
