



Dear Honorable Speaker:

On behalf of Washington & Madison, LLC (“W&M”), it is my honor to present this Letter Agreement establishing a Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) between Washington & Madison, LLC and the House of Representatives of the Republic of Liberia (the “House” or “Liberia”). This MOU sets forth the general framework governing our proposed collaboration.

I. Purpose and Scope of Representation

W&M will design and coordinate a legislative training and exchange program in the United States of America for Members of the Liberian Legislature.

The objective of this program is to enhance legislative capacity through exposure to established practices in democratic governance, legislative drafting, committee systems, oversight functions, ethics frameworks, constituent engagement, and comparative parliamentary systems. The program will include structured workshops, policy dialogues, and institutional visits with legislative bodies and governance-focused organizations.

The initiative will be tailored to ensure practical applicability within Liberia’s constitutional and legislative framework, with emphasis on institutional strengthening, transparency, accountability, and effective representation consistent with internationally recognized democratic standards.

As part of this program, W&M anticipates arranging meetings and engagements with, among others:

- Members of the United States Congress and state-level legislative officials
- Former and current senior U.S. diplomatic and executive branch officials

- Academic leaders and public policy research institutions
- Representatives of the U.S. business community

W&M has experience working with international partners, including institutions across Africa, and remains committed to delivering programming that reflects professionalism, cultural respect, and measurable institutional value.

W&M views this initiative as the foundation for a sustained and mutually beneficial institutional partnership. In addition to legislative exchange programming, W&M is prepared to explore opportunities to facilitate responsible foreign direct investment, strategic economic partnerships, and constructive engagement designed to support Liberia's long-term economic and infrastructure development priorities, subject to further discussion and mutual agreement.

II. Legal Compliance

Please note that while W&M is not engaged in a traditional "lobbying" contract on behalf of the Government of Liberia, W&M shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations of the United States, including but not limited to the Lobbying Disclosure Act (LDA), as amended, and the Foreign Agents Registration Act (FARA), as amended.

W&M anticipates that certain activities contemplated under this Agreement may require registration under FARA. Should such registration be required, W&M will independently undertake and maintain full compliance with all applicable registration, reporting, and disclosure obligations. W&M shall bear sole responsibility for its compliance with such laws.

III. Relationship and Terms of Engagement

The Parties agree that a separate written addendum will be executed at a later date setting forth the financial terms of the legislative training and exchange program, including program costs and the number of participating Members of the Legislature. Discussions regarding these matters remain ongoing.

While W&M seeks to ensure that reasonable program expenses are covered, this initiative is undertaken in the spirit of institutional partnership and long-term collaboration rather than short-term commercial gain. W&M is committed to investing in constructive engagement that benefits Liberia's institutions and people.

This Agreement shall become effective on March 15, 2026, and shall remain in effect through March 15, 2027. The Agreement may be renewed upon the mutual written consent of both Parties.

IV. Independent Contractor Status

The Parties acknowledge and agree that W&M shall serve as an independent contractor under this Agreement. Nothing herein shall be construed to create a partnership, joint venture, or employment relationship between the Parties.

W&M shall be free to provide services to other persons, entities, or governments, provided that such engagements do not create a conflict of interest with respect to its obligations under this Agreement.

The Parties agree to act in good faith and to take all reasonable steps necessary to fulfill their respective obligations under this Agreement.

V. General Provisions

a) Amendments. No amendment, modification, or waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be valid or binding unless set forth in a written instrument duly executed by both Parties.

b) Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable under applicable law, the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

c) Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the District of Columbia and the United States of America, without regard to its conflict of laws principles.

d) Jurisdiction. Any dispute arising under or relating to this Agreement shall be brought exclusively in a federal or state court of competent jurisdiction located in the District of Columbia. The prevailing party in any such action shall be entitled to recover reasonable attorney's fees and costs.

e) Waiver of Sovereign Immunity. To the extent permitted under applicable law, the Client expressly waives any claim of sovereign immunity for purposes of jurisdiction and enforcement pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1605(a)(1) of the Foreign Sovereign Immunities Act.

f) Confidentiality. During the term of this Agreement and thereafter, W&M shall not disclose confidential information received from Liberia or use such information for any purpose other than the performance of services under this Agreement.

g) Taxes and Contributions. W&M shall be solely responsible for payment of all federal, state, and local taxes and contributions required by law in connection with compensation received under this Agreement and for any compensation paid to its employees or contractors. W&M shall indemnify and hold Liberia harmless from any claims arising from its failure to fulfill such obligations.

VI. Acceptance

By signing and returning this Letter Agreement, the House of Representatives of the Republic of Liberia acknowledges and agrees to the terms set forth herein and authorizes Washington & Madison, LLC to proceed with the services described above.

We respectfully look forward to the opportunity to collaborate in strengthening legislative institutions and advancing constructive engagement between the Republic of Liberia and the United States.


