Dear Governor Chieng,

Thank you again for your generosity and for meeting with us during our time in Yap. I am writing to confirm the outcome of our August 30 meeting with you, the Speaker, and the Traditional Leaders from the Council, where you stated that you wished to retain our services to assist the State of Yap. This agreement confirms the terms of our representation as described below.

Scope:

We will represent Yap State (referred to as "Yap State" or "Client"). Our work will be to assist Yap State, through you and your office or your designee, with the legal matters related to the US military's proposed projects on Yap. Our assistance would include helping develop a process of obtaining information about these projects and recommendations on how to move forward in a way that ensures the best interest of the people of Yap and its community are protected. We will also assist Yap State with its interaction with the FSM national government related to US military's proposed actions for Yap.

We have not been retained to represent you generally or in connection with any other matter, other than Yap State's interests in evaluating the request to expand Yap State's airport and its runway, including matters related to the expansion, which we understand include modification to Yap State's wharf and submerged lands and reefs under its jurisdictional control ("Expansion Projects and Matters").

Lawyers

The work will be performed by KMB Law, Calvo Jacob & Pangelinan LLP and Camacho & Taitano, LLP (collectively the "Lawyers").

The Client acknowledges that the Lawyers may need to consult or retain additional attorneys to assist us with this representation, subject to the Client's approval.

The Client acknowledges that he has been informed that Kathleen M. Burch is admitted to practice in the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM) and is a member of the FSM bar. The Client further acknowledges that Rodney Jacob and Leevin Camacho are admitted to practice in

Guam and are members of the Guam bar. Attorneys Jacob and Camacho will be providing their services under this agreement under the Supervision of Attorney Burch.

The Client will provide a working space where 1) confidential conversations can take place, 2) confidential working materials can be stored and 3) the Lawyers can work when in Yap.

Fees and Expenses/Costs

The Client shall pay all legal fees and expenses and costs when due and until a supplemental source is identified, the Lawyers agree to work on a discounted fee basis on the terms and conditions provided below until such fees can be supplemented.

- Legal Fees

For most of our work, we will bill at our current hourly rates. My rate, and the rates for attorneys Leevin Camacho, Rodney Jacob and Alex Freeman is \$600/hour. The current hourly rates for Lawyers personnel are as follows:

Partners/Sr. Counsel:	\$500-600/hour
Associates:	\$400/hour
Legal Assistants:	\$75/hour

The rates on this schedule are subject to change on 60 days' written notice by the Firm to Client. If Client declines to pay increased rates, the Lawyers or any one of them will have the right to withdraw as attorney for Client. Moreover, given that the Client and Lawyers anticipate the 1) scope of this representation may expand and change based on the future provision of information related to the Expansion Projects and Matters, 2) the initial discounted rates and 3) risk and complexity associated with this representation as described below, the Client and Lawyers anticipate and are open to renegotiating fees from time to time to include a an hourly rate, percentage recovery and/or a contingency fee recovery (or a combination thereof). Any renegotiated fee must be in writing and approved by both Client and Lawyers.

Discounted Rates/Supplemental Sources

The parties to this Agreement shall seek supplemental sources to fund fees, expenses and costs, such as grants, third-party sources or the sale of property or assets related to the Expansion Projects or Matters ("Supplemental Source").

Until such time as a Supplemental Source is identified, the Client is required only to pay a discounted rate of \$125 per hour for all time invoiced by all Lawyers and \$50 per hour for time invoiced by Legal Assistants. Once a Supplemental Source of funding is identified, the Lawyers' fees shall be reimbursed to the full hourly rates set forth above from the beginning of our representation, less the amount paid by the Client. For the avoidance of doubt, Client shall not be liable for the payment of full hourly rates in the event Supplemental Source funding does not materialize nor for any balance of full hourly rates that Supplemental Source financing does not cover.

The Client acknowledges the nature of this representation justifies the proposed fees for among other reasons, the following: First, Yap has a limited number of attorneys who can provide effective representation for this matter and limited resources to advance Yap State's interests against the formidable interests seeking the use of Yap State's land and resources for the defense of international sovereigns and communities against global threats. This matter presents a complex and unique set of circumstances involving national and international legal issues and rights. The adversaries and potential adversaries are well funded, well-resourced and represent major sovereign interests. Second, the Lawyers represent a group of attorneys who have experience in the courts of Micronesia, including Yap, have unique experience in protecting or representing communities in Micronesia in matters involving major United States governmental action and activity directed at an island community and are willing to invest in a long-term representation that will require travel and work in remote or distance forums and potentially innumerable hours to resolve and to engage in difficult, novel and evolving legal issues concerning, among others, environmental equity and community participation. Third, the attitude and prior practices of the United States military and government to secure the approval of expansion projects are resolute and mission oriented and may not necessarily align with the Yap State community.

- Expenses/Costs

Expenses include, but are not limited to, travel. Costs include, but are not limited to, electronic research, translation costs, court costs, experts and consultants, costs for depositions, and filing fees if any. Expenses and Costs shall be reimbursed at the same costs to the Lawyers.

- Invoices

KMB Law will send you an invoice for work completed once a month; payment is due on receipt of the invoice.

Waiver of Potential Conflict

Conflicts may arise that cannot as yet be foreseen. If any conflicts arise during our representation of Yap State, through the Governor's Office, we will notify you in writing as soon as the conflict has been identified.

We have agreed to represent Yap State because we have been informed by the political, traditional and community leaders that they have been uninformed or underinformed about major actions that the United States military plans for Yap State and its people. Further, we understand the community and its leaders have not had the full opportunity to participate in an evaluation of such actions to understand the benefits and detriments to Yap State and its people, culture and traditions, and environment.

The actual or perceived absence of such opportunity deprives Yap State and its community from understanding and deciding whether the project offers an overall benefit to those living in Yap State and from understanding the cultural and environmental repercussions of any such major action. Because we have agreed to assist Yap State, through your Office, on the above basis, should a conflict arise because Yap State and other community stakeholders disagree on whether

to support or oppose the Expansion Projects and Matters, the Governor and the Governor's Office, for Yap State, hereby waives any actual or potential conflict of interest should the Lawyers (or any one of them) represent a client whose interest diverges for your own, or Yap State's as directed by the Governor or the Governor's Office, unless such client's interest is materially adverse to Yap's interest or such representation will be in a dispute to which Yap State will be an adverse party.

By signing below, you acknowledge your understanding of this provision and your consent and waiver of any such potential or actual conflict that may arise in the future. You further acknowledge that you have had the opportunity to have and have had this agreement reviewed by independent legal counsel in the Yap State Office of Attorney General,

Termination of Legal Services

By Yap State

You have the right to terminate our services upon written notice.

By the Lawyers

Subject to our obligations to you to maintain proper standards of professional conduct, we or any one of us individually reserve the right to terminate our services to you for good reasons which include, but are not limited to:

- (a) if you fail to cooperate with us in any reasonable request;
- (b) fail to pay our fees and costs in a timely manner; or
- (c) if our or any one of us continuing to act would be unethical or impractical.

Arbitration of All Disputes

Any dispute, claim or controversy between the Lawyers and Client relating to or arising from the construction, application or performance of any services under this Agreement, and any claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement or its breach, including, without limitation, claims for breach of contract, professional negligence, breach of fiduciary duty, misrepresentation, fraud and disputes regarding attorneys' fees and/or costs charged under this Agreement shall be submitted to binding arbitration upon the written request of one party after the service of that request on the other party. The parties agree that any and all disputes arising out of this Agreement, as stated herein, shall be settled by arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Commercial Arbitration Rules, and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator(s) may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. The cost of the arbitration, excluding legal fees and costs, shall be borne by the losing party or in such proportion as the arbitrator shall decide. The sole and exclusive venue for the arbitration and or any legal dispute, including without limitation enforcement of any arbitral award, shall be in Guam.

Because each party is giving up a right, Client is encouraged to have an independent lawyer of Client's choice review these arbitration provisions before agreeing to them.
