Item 8: Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.

International Policy Group retained the registrant under a six-month written consulting agreement to provide strategic advice, policy engagement, government relations, stakeholder engagement, resource mobilization, policy communications, and partnership development concerning IPG's Africa-focused constitutional, economic, commercial, educational, and strategic-sector initiatives. The work includes matters relating to constitutional democracy and liberty under law, free enterprise and market-oriented development, trade and investment, responsible mining and strategic-minerals development, transparent resource governance, education, technology, infrastructure, and institutional partnerships.

The work will be carried out through research, preparation of briefing materials, policy memoranda, investment and partnership proposals, correspondence, introductions, and virtual and in-person meetings with relevant government, policy, democracy-support, philanthropic, academic, investor, development-finance, mining, technology, and private-sector stakeholders.

The registrant will seek to inform and, where appropriate, influence U.S. government officials, policy institutions, nonprofit and philanthropic organizations, educational institutions, private-sector stakeholders, investors, and sections of the U.S. public concerning U.S.-Africa policy and IPG's interests in constitutional democracy, constitutional governance and resilience, constitutional liberty, equal protection under law, electoral integrity, lawful political succession, constitutional safeguards, peacebuilding, property rights, fair competition, free enterprise and market-oriented economic development, responsible resource governance, responsible mining and strategic-minerals development, transparent licensing, beneficial ownership, accountable resource governance, education, technology, infrastructure, trade, investment, strategic capital, and institutional partnership development.

Activities may include lobbying and policy advocacy involving congressional and executive-branch officials and staff; meetings and communications with government officials; outreach to policy, democracy-support, philanthropic, educational, academic, media, investor, development-finance, mining, technology, and private-sector stakeholders; development of educational, research, institutional, trade, investment, mining, technology, and strategic-sector partnerships; public relations, promotion, and perception-management activities; promotion of institutional, economic-development, philanthropic, trade, investment, and strategic-capital support; and preparation and dissemination of memoranda, briefing papers, talking points, emails, presentations, proposals, investment briefs, and other informational materials.

CONSULTING AND STRATEGIC ENGAGEMENT AGREEMENT

This Consulting and Strategic Engagement Agreement (“Agreement”) is entered into as of July 13, 2026, by and between:

International Policy Group (“IPG”), a Nairobi, Kenya-based policy, governance, peacebuilding, and strategic-advisory organization; and

Garcia Mavinga Sozinho (“Consultant”), an independent U.S. policy, business, and government-relations consultant.

IPG and Consultant may be referred to individually as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties.”

1. Purpose

IPG engages Consultant to provide strategic advisory, policy-engagement, government-relations, stakeholder-engagement, resource-mobilization, and policy-communications support in connection with IPG’s Africa-focused constitutional-governance, constitutional-resilience, institutional-continuity, economic-development, responsible-resource-governance, private-sector-engagement, and strategic-engagement initiative advanced by IPG (the “Initiative”).

2. Scope of Services

Consultant shall provide services to IPG in connection with the Initiative, including:

- a. Advising on U.S.-facing and international engagement strategy relating to governance, constitutional resilience, institutional continuity, economic development, responsible resource governance, U.S.–Africa trade and investment, private-sector engagement, and shared U.S.–Africa strategic interests;
- b. Supporting relationship development with U.S. government stakeholders, policy institutions, nonprofit organizations, philanthropic organizations, private-sector stakeholders, strategic-sector stakeholders, and other relevant audiences;
- c. Preparing policy materials, briefing notes, strategic memoranda, engagement summaries, talking points, and related policy-communications materials; and
- d. Supporting lawful efforts to develop U.S.-based strategic, institutional, resource-mobilization, trade, investment, philanthropic, private-sector, and stakeholder support for IPG’s Africa-focused public-policy, governance, peacebuilding, economic-development, responsible-resource-governance, and strategic-engagement work, including by helping create U.S.-facing pathways for IPG and relevant Initiative stakeholders to engage U.S. counterparts around broader trade, investment, sectoral, commercial, and strategic interests, including in areas such as mining, technology, infrastructure, strategic capital, responsible resource development, and related strategic sectors.

3. Term

The term of this Agreement shall begin on July 13, 2026 and continue for a period of six (6) months, unless extended, amended, or terminated earlier by either Party upon fifteen (15) days' written notice.

Any fees earned or expenses approved before the effective date of termination shall remain payable.

4. Compensation

IPG shall pay Consultant a professional fee of USD 15,000 per month, payable monthly in advance during the term of this Agreement, unless the Parties agree in writing to a different payment schedule.

Subsequent monthly payments shall be due monthly during the term, unless the Agreement is terminated earlier in accordance with Section 3.

Reasonable and pre-approved expenses, if any, shall be reimbursed separately by IPG.

5. FARA Compliance

The Parties acknowledge that Consultant intends to register, as required, under the Foreign Agents Registration Act ("FARA") in connection with services performed under this Agreement.

IPG shall cooperate with Consultant in connection with any required FARA registration, reporting, disclosure, or related compliance obligations, including by providing information reasonably necessary regarding IPG's identity, objectives, relationship to Consultant, the Initiative, payments, reimbursements, disbursements, reportable activities, and any other information required for filings connected to this Agreement.

Consultant shall perform the services in accordance with applicable U.S. registration, reporting, disclosure, and transparency requirements.

6. No Authority to Bind

Consultant shall not have authority to bind IPG to any contract, financial obligation, legal undertaking, partnership, representation, public statement, or public position unless expressly authorized in writing by IPG.

7. Confidentiality

Consultant shall maintain the confidentiality of non-public information received from IPG and shall use such information only for purposes related to this Agreement, subject to applicable legal, regulatory, professional, and disclosure obligations.

8. Independent Contractor

Consultant shall act as an independent contractor and not as an employee, officer, director, partner, or joint venturer of IPG.

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to create an employment, partnership, or joint-venture relationship between the Parties.

9. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the understanding of the Parties with respect to the services described herein and may be amended only by written agreement of the Parties.

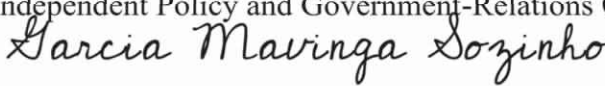
