In order to avoid a result which would eliminate Japanese crabbing operations on the Continental Shelf and, in particular, to avoid any substantial impediment to present Japanese crabbing operations in the Bering Sea region, which may result from S. 1968, the Japan Fishery Society agrees to retain the services of H. William Tanka under the following terms and conditions.

1. Research and preparation of a statement on behalf of the Japan Fishery Society to be submitted to the House Subcommittee on Fisheries and Wildlife Conservation after the hearings on S. 1968, but before the record is closed.

2. To inform members of the Subcommittee considering S. 1968 as well as other U.S. executive and administrative agencies concerned, of the unresolved international legal issues inhering in such matters as the Continental Shelf Convention, and to present the facts relating to various restrictions imposed on Japanese crab fishing designed to protect and conserve the crab resources now being considerably utilized by the Japanese, in order that all relevant facts bearing on these matters are clearly and accurately understood, and, accordingly, work to avoid restriction of Japanese crabbing operations on the Continental Shelf.

3. This retainer contract will be effective until conclusion of action on S. 1968 by the House of Representatives.

4. The total retainer fee shall be \$4,000. However, if at any time it becomes clear from the deliberations that restriction of Japanese crab fishing is a virtual certainty, any further services to be rendered thereafter shall be subject to further consultation.
