

Specific Services To Be Rendered:

1. To render legal analysis services with regard to legislative and administrative proposals or actions which may affect the export to the United States of any Japanese electronic products manufactured by the members of the Association with emphasis on those products which are currently involved or likely to be involved as subjects of restrictive action in the United States. These services to be rendered will be submitted in written form when deemed appropriate by Counsel or at the request of the EIA-J.

2. Your Association will be informed of legislative and administrative proposals or actions of any nature which may affect in any manner the importation of any product manufactured by the members of your Association.

Information supplied in a form which will enable the appropriate persons within your Association to form a quick familiarity with the more important issues involved.


3. In rendering information reportorial services, activities in Congress bearing on U.S.-Japan trade will be covered.

4. In addition to the foregoing, publicly available copies of the various bills introduced, hearing records, administrative orders, press releases, and other relevant documentary materials issued by the Government will be transmitted to your organization.

All of the above described services shall be rendered at a fee of \$40,000.00 (Forty Thousand Dollars). This fee shall include all reasonable necessary expenses incidental to the rendition of the described services. The contract shall become effective April 1, 1982, and terminate March 31, 1983.

This contract shall not include services to be rendered specifically with respect to any particular legislative, administrative or judicial action in which the Association and/or its members might in the future become involved, such as court action, an escape clause proceeding, an antidumping proceeding or the like.
